n keeping with West Des Moines' long tradition of hosting major events, RAGBRAI is coming through West Des Moines Tuesday, July 23rd. Riders will be passing through town coming from Van Meter on their way to the overnight stop at Water Works Park in Des Moines. The route through West Des Moines will be Raccoon River Drive, to Grand Avenue,

to Railroad Avenue to 5th Street, to Elm Street to 1st Street and south to Park to enter the City of Des Moines. Along the way, riders will be encouraged to stop and have a great time in Valley Junction. Plans are coming together for a party on 5th Street similar to Thursday nights during the summer. We've been calling it "Farmer's Market on a Tuesday afternoon" around the office. Fifth Street will be closed as with a typical Farmer's Market. WDM Police Raising Funds For K9 Unit

Last month this space contained an article about the retirement of Rony, our City's K9 officer, after 9 years of service. The City of West Des Moines wishes to continue the K9 Unit and to expand it to include two K9 teams. The K9 Unit was first developed in October 2000 after a community survey indicated that narcotics enforcement was an area in which residents desired to have the police department focus. Properly trained K9s decrease the time it takes for officers to conduct a building search for hidden suspects and narcotics and increase officer safety by alerting officers to hidden dangers.

The K9 Unit assists school administrators with school narcotic sniffs of lockers and vehicles on school property and educating area youth about the dangers of drugs.

The West Des Moines Police Department hopes to raise \$70,000 for each K9 team which covers the purchase of the dog, an 18-week training course and needed equipment for the K9 and handler. The Department hopes to be able to raise enough for the first K9 Unit by July 1, 2013 in order to have the K9 patrolling the city by early 2014.

Recently there were a series of articles in the Des Moines Register regarding EMS systems in Iowa. These articles are not indicative of the high level of service provided by the West Des Moines EMS Department. The City of West Des Moines EMS has been accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Ambulance Services since 2001 and is one of only three ambulance services in the state that are accredited. The West Des Moines Fire and Police Departments are also accredited, making West Des Moines one of only three cities in the entire nation with all three public safety departments accredited and among 39 in the nation with both Police and Fire accredited.



Accreditation surpasses Iowa Department of Public Health EMS Bureau Guidelines and is the gold standard for ambulances to obtain on a national level.

Staffing and Coverage:

The West Des Moines EMS has three ambulances staffed by Paramedics 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. The City has the ability to bring on two additional ambulance crews through agreements with other agencies during especially busy times. Each ambulance is staffed at the Critical Care Paramedic Level, which is a professional endorsement that all West Des Moines Paramedics have beyond a paramedic certification. In addition, the West Des Moines EMS has two phy-

sician medical directors who oversee operations and who approve of all protocols in responding to calls. Both physician medical directors are emergency room physicians.

Ambulances are stationed through the city to provide the most rapid and efficient response to calls for service. Because the ambulances are mobile units, they can be moved when one is on a call to ensure the remaining two ambulances are in the most optimum position to respond to a call anywhere in the city.

Hiring Process:

All full-time staff are hired through the Civil Service Process. The Human Resources Department completes criminal background checks on all new hires through the Iowa Division of Criminal Investigation and with out of state agencies for those new hires coming from out of state.



All new hires must pass interviews, written testing, physical ability testing and a post offer physical and drug screen. All applicants are confirmed to be properly certified through the lowa Department of Public Health Database and reference checks are completed on all applicants.

Driving:

All medics must have a Class D endorsement driver's license which is checked annually to ensure each medic has a valid license. All medics must pass a national emergency vehicle operation course before they are allowed to drive an ambulance. All medics also

must pass an initial practice driving test with the ambulance. Each year all medics receive continuing education and must successfully pass a practical driving test through a set course.

Response Standards:

The West Des Moines EMS response time standard is 8 minutes or less 90% of the time from the time the dispatcher receives the call to the time an ambulance arrives on the scene. This is a national standard for emergency ambulance response. The West Des Moines EMS meets this standard greater than 90% of the time. The majority of responses are 5 minutes or less.

 will deter thieves from getting inside and
 possibly activating a trunk or hood release.
- Always report suspicious activity to law enforcement as soon as possible.

The opening ceremony will take place from 5:00-5:30 PM with a picnic and activities to follow until 8:00 PM.







Springtime Fire Safety

The arrival of spring is a great time to remember and practice the following fire safety tips:

- -Check all smoke detectors in your home and replace the batteries inside them
- -Make sure all windows and doors on your home open easily and as far as they were designed to do
- -Ensure your address is clearly visible from the street
- -If you're putting away holiday decorations, take time to check light strands or extension cords for damage. If you find any damage, throw them away to prevent an accident next holiday season
- -Discuss and practice fire escape plans with all family members to ensure everyone will know what to do should a fire happen in your home.

Outdoor cooking grills cause more than 6,000 fires annually in the United States. Most charcoal grill fires are the result of hot embers falling on wood decks or being too close to buildings during use, while the majority of gas grill fires are caused by tank leaks, blocked tubes or being too close to buildings during use. As the weather starts to get nice, outdoor grills will start getting used more frequently. Make sure your grill is in proper working condition and be sure to only use them a safe distance away from combustible materials and buildings.

PCC Patching – Various streets will be receiving pavement patching.

Parking Lots – 4th Street and 6th Street in the Valley Junction area

Vine Street from 1st Street to 6th Street – starting around the 1st of June
