

TRAFFIC SAFETY !!!

Safety Focus for the month (and always) of February 2014.

Based on feedback from our leadership team, the #1 pick to prevent injuries and fatalities had to do with Traffic Safety---here are the specific things identified that Officers and personnel should review during February and bring up almost every shift for discussion.

- a) Review Traffic Related SOGs!
- b) 100% mandatory use/enforcement of traffic vests (no exceptions)!
- c) Encourage Duty Officer to help protect the scene on all traffic accidents.
- d) Proper use (SOG) of vehicle lighting on emergency scenes,
- e) Proper vehicle placement on traffic accidents (SOG)
- f) Establish a Traffic Spotter when possible.
- g) Use of Tiger Flares & Traffic Cones
- h) Situational Awareness of Slip/Fall risks (ice, slopes, etc.)

Based on your focused attention/review /training, I anticipate that ideas will come forward to improve our situations (SOGs, etc.) Please funnel those through D.C. Eslick, the Chair of our Health/Safety Committee).

Personally, I think this is the most risky environment we work in that could cause injury/death so I am please you also recognize that risk and want to do something about it. It is up to each and every one of you. This includes all administrative staff that stops at vehicle accidents/disabled cars.

All.

Every fire and EMS Department operates on roadways-so here is another one we need to know about and share with the troops in your firehouse. And while many FD's do what we are trained to do by folks such

as www.ResponderSafety.com, the drunks are everywhere...and we cannot expect normalcy and directed behavior when they are involved.

In this case, they were doing everything right while assisting a stranded motorist, using warning lights and arrow boards, yet still a careless, drunk semi-driver ran them over resulting in this tragic outcome. In this case, a tollway worker from Illinois died and an Illinois State trooper was hospitalized night after a fiery crash along Interstate 88. The trooper and the highway safety worker were helping a disabled semitrailer truck about 2145 hours in the eastbound lanes of I-88 in Aurora when another semitrailer truck barreled into them. District 15 State Trooper Douglas J. Balder, 38, was listed this morning in critical condition, but is conscious and expected to recover.

Killed in the line of duty was Illinois Highway Safety Worker Vincent Petrella. Petrella had pulled over on Interstate 88 in Aurora in the bitter cold night for a semi that had broken down when another semi crashed into a state trooper's squad car which then crashed into his truck in a fiery explosion. Petrella, 39 and the father of two, died at the scene. Trooper Douglas J. Balder, 38, remains in critical but stable condition.

DUI DRIVER CHARGED: Cops charged Renato V. Velasquez, 46, in connection with the accident. Velasquez was charged with operating a commercial vehicle while impaired/fatigued, filing a false report of record and duty status, driving more than 14 hours and driving beyond the 11 hour rule, all class four felonies. He was also charged with failure to reduce speed to avoid an accident and failure to yield to stationary emergency vehicles in violation of the Illinois Scott's Law.

accident that occurred in Illinois night about 25 miles west of Chicago. While not a FF LODD, but roadway safety workers and cops work with us all, daily. In this case the Tollway Worker was killed and the State Trooper remains in critical condition after the fiery crash and extrication handled by the Aurora Fire Department. They were doing everything right while assisting a stranded motorist, using warning lights and arrow boards, yet still a careless, drunk semi-driver ran them over resulting in this tragic outcome.

It could have been any of us.
