est Des Moines staff are constantly working to deliver services as efficiently and effectively as possible for our residents. I recently announced a new change that we think will help us serve you better.

In just the last few days, code enforcement responsibilities have moved from the Police Department to Public Works, and effective with this move, Code Enforcement will be called *Community Compliance*. Staff will continue to handle common code enforcement issues such as junk cars, weeds and grass over 10 inches or more, and snow and ice removal from sidewalks. We think this move makes sense because it complements the work Public Works employees do every day in the

public right-of-way when they are out working on streets, sidewalks and potholes. #### West Des Moines parks are now tobacco and nicotine free

### Let us help you dispose of unused or expired drugs

If you need to dispose of unused or expired medication, please note that we have two excellent chances for you to remove these items safely from your home or apartment!

On Saturday, April 30, 2016, from 10:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m., you can drop off unused or expired medication to the West Des Moines Police Department at 250 Mills Civic Parkway as part of the National Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) Drug Take-Back Program.

Just drive up and hand your medications to one of the officers. You don't even have to get out of your vehicle. It's fast, easy and safe! For more information, contact Officer Jeff Hartshorn at jeff.hartshorn@wdm.iowa.gov or call him at 222-3333.

The West Des Moines Police Department also has a **MedReturn box** located at the Police Department inside the first set of doors immediately to your left. These doors are open 24 hours a

day for your convenience. Items that are accepted in the MedReturn box include prescriptions, prescription patches, over-the-counter medications, ointments, creams and lotions, vitamins and supplements, medications for pets, and liquid medication in leak proof plastic containers.



Items *not* accepted include inhalers, needles (sharps), glass bottles, aerosol cans, thermometers, bloody or infectious waste, hydrogen peroxide and rubbing alcohol.

#### WDM Fire Department receives Accredited Agency Status

The West Des Moines Fire Department recently received Accredited Agency status with the Commission

on Fire Accreditation International (CFAI) for meeting the criteria established through the CFAI's accreditation program.

West Des Moines Fire is one of over 200 agencies to achieve Internationally Accredited Agency status with the CFAI and the Center for Public Safety Excellence, Inc. Of the approximately 731 fire departments in the state of Iowa, only four are internationally ac-

credited. West Des Moines Fire has held accredited status since 2006 and was the first accredited agency in the state.

Fire Chief Craig Leu said the agency's achievement

shows a commitment of our elected officials, leadership and employees to strive for continual improve-

ment. "We believe that by having our system and process's evaluat-

ed by experts from across the country, we can strive to provide the best services possible to the citizens we protect." Chief Leu also said that the process of accreditation

"allows our organization to be
proactive and plan for the future

of our growing city." The accreditation process was managed by Deputy Chief Jack Benge and involved all levels of the organization and other City departments. Accreditation status is good through 2021 and will be monitored by CFAI with yearly updates.

#### 2015 Channel Repair Program

Project Status: Work will include bank repair and stabilization of Jordan Creek adjacent to the Jordan Creek Trail at two locations between 50th Street and 60th Street. The contractor has started work on the project, and this will affect the Jordan Creek Trail from I-35 to 50th Street and Prairie View Drive to 56th Street. It is anticipated the work on this portion will last approximately one month pending weather.

Secure paper shredding is an added service available to West Des Moines residents during this event! You are encouraged to bring old documents and watch a shredding truck destroy your paperwork. No prep needed – leave any paper clips, staples, rubber bands, binder/metal clips, hanging file folders or manila file folders with your documents. No 3-ring binders or plastic allowed.

#### Yard waste collection is here!

Yard waste collection runs weekly from March 28 through December 2, 2016. Residents can dispose of yard waste right from the curb through Metro Waste Authority's Compost It! program. Curbside pickup is on your garbage day with two easy options:

#### 1. Bags & Stickers

Compost It! Bags

The cost of this bag covers the cost of collection. No sticker is required. Do not exceed 40 lbs. per bag.



#### Store-brand Bag + Compost It! Sticker

A Compost It! sticker must be attached to a generic bag. The sticker cost covers the cost of collection. It's a good idea to face the sticker toward the street so the hauler can see it.

#### Compost It! Sticker + Brush Bundles

Attach a Compost It! sticker to each brush bundle and place it next to carts or bags. Bundles cannot exceed 18 inches in diameter or four feet in length.

#### 2. Cart

A Compost It! cart is on wheels, just like your Curb It! cart, making it a convenient alternative to yard waste bags. Simply wheel it to the curb on garbage day during Compost It! season. The 96-gallon cart can hold the equivalent of three yard waste bags, but you can always use the Bags & Sticker program if your yard waste exceeds the cart's capacity.

#### Purchase Bags, Stickers & Cart Subscriptions

The cost of the Compost It! bag, sticker and annual cart subscription covers the cost of collection and processing of the material.

Compost It! Bags	\$8.00 for a bundle of five (\$1.60 per bag). Sold at most grocery and hardware stores.
Compost It! Stickers	\$1.25 per sticker. Sold at most grocery and hardware stores.
