
values its police officers and demonstrates so much respect and support for each other. For more information and to find out how you can donate to his memorial, please turn to page 2.

On August 3, West Des Moines Senior Police Officer Shawn Miller was returning from a deposition in Dallas County when he was killed in a traffic accident.

Officer Miller was promoted posthumously to the rank of Sergeant. He will be missed by his family, his coworkers and the many people whose lives he touched in our community.

Embrace Iowa

Embrace lowa is an assistance program funded by donations from local businesses and residents that is offered through the Des Moines Register. Cash grants are awarded to households who need some type of short-term assistance because of an emergency or hardship.

Examples of non-routine emergency expenses that may be requested include medical bills, prescription medication and other health care costs as well as home and auto repairs, beds, appliances and even

mortgage payments. Embrace lowa is intended for unemployed or underemployed households who are considered to be low income based on federal poverty guidelines.

West Des Moines' new fire engine



Thanks to a DNR/EPA grant of \$125,000, West Des Moines was able to retire an old fire engine and purchase a refurbished demonstrator unit for just over \$511,000.

Engine 180 is 32-feet long and 10-feet high, and it carries 750 gallons of water and can pump 1,500 gallons per minute. All the equipment from inside the old truck, such as hoses, firefighting tools, breathing apparatus and medical supplies, will be transferred to the new truck.

This fine piece of equipment, which was built in Appleton, Wisconsin by Pierce Manufacturing, is now in service at Station 18 at 50th Street and Grand Avenue.

Public Works transitions to Public Services

The West Des Moines Public Works Department will change its name on September 1 to Public Services to better reflect recent organizational changes that have transferred new responsibilities to the department.

Public Services will oversee parks operations, urban forestry, community compliance (formerly code enforcement) and continue with their traditional responsibilities of maintaining streets, traffic maintenance, solid waste, yard waste and recycling and sewer maintenance.

Bret Hodne, who has served as Public Works
Director since 2009, said his title will change to
Public Services Director and no significant costs
would be associated with the name change.
Employees will continue to wear clothing with the
former department names until it's worn out and
ready to be replaced. Items such as business
cards also will be changed as new ones are
ordered. "Our employees felt Public Services was
more reflective of their role in the community, so
we're pleased to make this change," he said.

Construction Update



University Avenue Construction Update

With the completion of asphalt paving, no additional overnight full closures are anticipated on University Avenue. Lane closures will be in place as the contractor completes sidewalk ramp replacements and manhole adjustments generally moving from east to west along the corridor.

South 50th Street Reconstruction Project (connects EP True Parkway to Mills Civic Parkway)

Estimated Completion: Fall 2016

The general contractor is setting up to pave the northbound outside lane between Mills Civic Parkway and Bentley Drive. Sections of Bentley Drive have been poured and crews have poured the patches on South 50th Street between Mills Civic and Bentley Drive. Crews also have poured the eastbound to northbound turn lane on Mills Civic Parkway and they are installing storm sewer pipe and structures between the Raintree and Wistful Vista area. Crews will move to the Bentley Drive area next.

Grand Prairie Parkway (Connects I-80 Interchange to Mills Civic Parkway)

Estimated Completion: Fall 2016

The Grand Prairie Parkway project will include grading, utilities and paving the roadway from the I-80 Interchange to Mills Civic Parkway. The bridge over Sugar Creek is essentially done with the exception of removing falsework (temporary structures used in construction) and installing fencing. The grading contractor is doing the subgrade prep for paving operations which are scheduled to begin in early September.

South 60th Street Reconstruction Project (connects Grand Avenue to south of Mills Civic Parkway)

Estimated Completion: Fall 2016

The South 60th Street project includes grading, utilities and paving of the roadway from Grand Avenue to south of Mills Civic Parkway. The contractor has paved two lanes from Grand Avenue to Booneville Road and crews are setting up to pour the third lane on the same segment. Crews also will re-establish the DMACC driveway once the third lane is poured and it has time to cure. The storm and sanitary sewer subcontractor will return in early September to complete water main, sanitary and storm sewer work at the north end of the project.
