
Our Parks and Recreation staff also enjoy springtime activities, and I want to highlight Fairmeadows Park, which is in the process of undergoing major improvements as we complete a storm sewer replacement project that took place last winter. As with many of our neighborhood parks, residents have expressed a lot of interest in what's happening, so we decided to try a new method of providing information on our website, and

that method is called "story mapping."

The screenshot below shows you a story map that allows you to scroll through information and view maps and photos that explain all the changes we'll be making in the park. Fairmeadows was

a great project for this because the replacement of the storm sewer pipe required the removal of several park facilities including outdated playground equipment, sidewalks, the west volleyball court and park lights.

## When you changed your clock, did you change your batteries?

The West Des Moines Fire Department is reminding everyone that the transition to daylight savings time is the perfect time to change your

smoke detector batteries.

The rule of thumb is to replace your batteries once every year when you set your clocks for daylight savings time.

It's a fact that fresh batteries decrease the chances of bat-

teries failing in case of a fire. In addition to changing your batteries, it's also important to

check your smoke detector monthly to ensure that it's working properly.

Statistics show that about 3 out of 5 homes do not have working smoke detectors despite the fact that detectors cut in half the chances of someone dying in a fire.

So take a moment and make sure you change those batteries! If you have elderly rela-

tives or neighbors, it's a good idea to check and see if they could use a helping hand.

Please Note: Residents participating in the City-provided solid waste collection may dispose of TVs and monitors of any type by putting each item at the curb by 6 a.m. on their normal collection day with the appropriate stickers.

## Spring is here — and so is yard waste collection!

#### Yard Waste Collection begins April 3

The season for yard work is almost upon us! Curbside yard waste collection starts the week of **April 3** and continues through November. Yard waste cannot be disposed of in your normal garbage. Residents have the option to use Compost It! bags, stickers or carts. The Compost It! name pays for the cost of collection.

#### Bags

If you put yard waste into a Compost It! brand bag, no sticker is required. Do not exceed 40 lbs. of material per bag. Bags are sold for \$8.00 per bundle of five, and you can find them at most grocery and hardware stores.

#### **Stickers**



If you're using a generic compost bag, attach a Compost It! Sticker to the bag and make sure the sticker is visible to the hauler from the street. Compost It! stickers should also be attached to brush bundles. Bundles cannot exceed 18 inches in diameter or four

feet in length. Stickers are sold for \$1.25 and are also available at most grocery and hardware stores.



#### Carts

If you regularly have a lot of yard waste, a Compost It! cart could be the solution for you. The cart is 96 gallons and can hold the equivalent of three yard waste bags. If you purchase more than 65 bags a year,

or simply don't want to hassle with bags, the cart is a nice alternative.



Carts are available for a \$105 annual service fee, plus a one-time cart purchase of \$60 (\$80 with delivery) to begin the program.
