MEETING MINUTES PUBLIC WORKS COUNCIL COMMITTEE Monday, July 18, 2016

Meeting called to order at 11:32 a.m.

1. <u>Iowa Interstate Railroad Bridge Agreement</u>

Issue Summary:

Principal Engineer Ben McAlister reported that the City contracted with HDR to conduct a study of Sugar Creek over the last couple of years. The study was to determine estimated elevations and recommendations for improving the drainage of Sugar Creek. To increase conveyance, HDR's recommendation was to widen the channel and lengthen the railroad bridge and the Sugar Creek bridge to allow more water to flow through and the flood plain to be decreased (Item 1.1). The timing of the project is beneficial for the City because the Iowa Interstate Railroad has plans to replace the bridge at milepost 369.7 (369.7 Bridge). The existing 369.7 Bridge is 114 feet in length, and the bridge replacement will be 204 feet in length, an estimated 43.6% increase in length. A draft Bridge Construction Agreement prepared by the Iowa Interstate Railroad stipulates the Railroad will construct the 369.7 Bridge with the City participating in the additional cost of the bridge extension (Item 1.2). The estimated cost to the City for the 43.6% is \$490,000. It was noted that this project is funded by TIF revenue generated by Mills Sub-district #7 (Microsoft Project Mountain Data Center). It was noted that with the project, the City will take on the responsibility of the maintenance of the channel. Staff will present the Bridge Construction Agreement at an upcoming Council meeting.

Direction: Information Only.

2. S. 60th Street Sanftner Property

Issue Summary:

Mr. McAlister reported on staff's review of the impact of the proposed trail on the trees at the Sanftner property on South 60th Street. Currently there are nine trees in the City ROW. It was noted that the property owner planted the trees in the City ROW without obtaining permission to do so. A map was shown illustrating the trail outlined with light blue lines and the clear zone outlined with a dashed red line (Item 2). Of the nine trees in the City ROW, four of the trees need to be removed because they are in the clear zone. The remaining trees would require significant pruning to meet the clear zone requirements. It was noted that due to the type of trees, continual maintenance would be required and most likely have to occur on an annual basis. There was

discussion about potential health concerns with the trees after the required pruning was completed, as well as effects of de-icing chemicals used on the trail and their impact on the trees. Staff's initial recommendation was to remove all nine trees. After additional review, staff maintains their original recommendation to remove all nine trees.

<u>Direction:</u> Due to the aesthetic aspect of the trees after the required pruning, as well as the challenges of ongoing maintenance of the trees, the PWCC concurs with staff recommendation to remove all nine trees. Staff will communicate this direction to the property owner.

3. Request for Night Work – 2014 Street Rehabilitation Sidewalk Ramp Program Issue Summary:

The contractor (McGregor Corporation) for the 2014 Street Rehabilitation Sidewalk Ramp Program has requested to perform night work to alleviate traffic control issues and help stay on schedule. There are several locations where this work would be conducted, all of which are west of 60th Street on EP True Parkway in Dallas County and not adjacent to any residential areas. The work will take place from approximately August 1-19. Staff recommends allowing the contractor to conduct night work.

Direction: The PWCC concurs with staff recommendation to allow night work on the project.

4. Request for Weekend Work – S. 50th Street Widening, Mills Civic Pkwy to EP True Pkwy *Issue Summary:*

The contractor (Absolute Concrete) for the S. 50th Street Widening project has requested to perform weekend work, proposing to begin at 6 a.m. and ending at 5 p.m. Staff recommends allowing the contractor to perform weekend work but delaying the start time to 8 a.m. The PWCC expressed concerns about weekend work beginning at 8 a.m. and recommends that the start time be subject to revisions based on residential feedback.

<u>Direction:</u> The PWCC concurs with staff recommendation to allow the contractor to perform weekend work beginning at 8 a.m. and ending at 5 p.m., with a provision that the weekend start hours may be changed to a later time if opposition is received from residents.

<u>Direction:</u> The PWCC concurs with staff recommendations on the Council agenda items.

6. Staff Updates

A. <u>DART Bench Update</u> – Public Works staff met with DART to review various locations in the City where benches can be installed at bus stops. The original request for a bench to be installed at 4th and Prospect was reviewed and there is insufficient right of way to install the bench at that location. Staff and DART recommend relocating the bus stop south approximately 350 feet where there is adequate room near the north side of American Legion Park. The southwest corner of 22nd Street and Westown Parkway is another recommended location for a bench and trash can. DART will ask the property owner to coordinate trash removal.

Several other locations identified for installing a bench are near residential properties and DART would prefer to communicate with the residents prior to installing benches at those locations (Item 6A). Staff has asked DART to target five or six locations for bench installations. Staff recommends moving forward with bench installation as soon as possible at the 4th and Prospect location and the 22nd and Westown Parkway location.

Direction: The PWCC concurs with staff recommendation.

7. Other Matters

A. Construction <u>Updates</u>:

It was reported that the contractor will be re-lining the entire sewer line south of Coachlight Court east of South 60th Street for the second time. The re-lining process will begin July 18, 2016, and could take up to three days to complete. Note that immediately after the PWCC meeting the schedule for the re-lining was revised due to forecasted rain. The re-lining was rescheduled for July 20-22. Residents were notified of the change in schedule.

It was reported that the intersection improvements located at Jordan Creek Parkway and University Avenue started July 18, 2016. The contractor will perform work from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. each day. Work will move to the outside north bound lanes next week and is estimated to take one week. The total estimated time for the project is two weeks, pending weather conditions.

It was reported that the 50th Street Widening project is currently experiencing some delays due to utility conflicts with Century Link and other minor utility conflicts.

It was reported that the 50th Street & Corporate Drive and 50th Street & University Avenue turn lane project is anticipated to start in mid-August. Sidewalk removal and rough grading is complete. Utility conflicts are anticipated to be completed in the next 30 days.

Direction: Information Only.

B. Utility Conflicts With Construction Projects:

Council Member Kevin Trevillyan stated that an issue regarding utility conflicts came about during the pre-construction meeting for the 50th Street Widening project. Council Member Trevillyan is concerned with the lack of urgency demonstrated by the majority of utility companies on construction projects. The contractors for construction projects are obligated to meet a completion date and are assessed liquidated damages if the work is not completed by the deadline, however, there is no similar responsibility placed on utility companies. Many of the City's construction projects are delayed because of the wait that is involved with utility companies completing their necessary work before construction can begin. Council Member Trevillyan would like staff to research what can be done to mitigate this issue.

<u>Direction:</u> Legal will research the issue to determine if the City can improve the process from a legal standpoint.

C. Haul Route Request:

It was reported that Elder Corporation is requesting to haul material from S. 8th Street and Pine Avenue in West Des Moines to SE 37th Street in Urbandale for their 100th Street project. Maps were provided outlining the proposed haul route (Item 7C). Staff recommends approving the haul route and will ensure the loads are of the legal weight limit.

Direction: The PWCC concurs with staff recommendation.

The meeting adjourned at 12:15 p.m. The next Public Works Council Committee meeting is scheduled for August 1, 2016.




Figure 18. Sugar Creek Alternative 4

BRIDGE CONSTRUCTION AGREEMENT

This Bridge Construction Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into this _____ day of June, 2016, ("Effective Date") by and between **IOWA INTERSTATE RAILROAD**, LTD., (RAILROAD) of 5900 6th Street SW, Cedar Rapids, Iowa, 52404 and **CITY OF WEST DES MOINES, IOWA**, (CITY), 4200 Mills Civic Parkway, West Des Moines, Iowa 50265

WHEREAS, Iowa Interstate Railroad, Ltd. owns and operates on and over a railroad bridge located at railroad Milepost 369.7 (369.7 Bridge), said bridge which crosses Sugar Creek in West Des Moines, Iowa;

WHEREAS, RAILROAD has determined that it will replace its existing 369.7 Bridge with a new structure;

WHEREAS, the 369.7 Bridge is adjacent and parallel to Raccoon River Drive in West Des Moines, Iowa.

WHEREAS, CITY owns and operates Raccoon River Drive, a public road which crosses Sugar Creek via a bridge (Sugar Creek Bridge);

WHEREAS, CITY wishes to replace its existing Sugar Creek Bridge with a larger structure;

WHEREAS, CITY has requested RAILROAD increase the size of the replacement 369.7 Bridge in order to facilitate CITY's plans to replace the Sugar Creek Bridge;

WHEREAS, RAILROAD is amenable to CITY's demands and the parties have negotiated this Agreement to provide for the construction of the 369.7 Bridge in such a manner to accommodate the CITY's plans for the Sugar Creek Bridge.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY AND RAILROAD DO HEREBY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. <u>Bridge Construction to be Performed by Railroad.</u>

The CITY and RAILROAD have prepared plans and specifications relative to the construction of the 369.7 Bridge, attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by this reference ("Project"). RAILROAD has reviewed these plans and specifications. RAILROAD agrees to construct the Project with its own forces, contractors, or a combination thereof.

SECTION 2: Reimbursement for Project.

RAILROAD's existing 369.7 Bridge is 114-ft in length. Pursuant to the CITY's demands, the replacement 369.7 Bridge shall be 204-ft in length. CITY agrees to reimburse RAILROAD for those costs associated with this additional construction in an amount totaling Forty Three and Six-Tenths (43.6%) of RAILROAD's Project costs incurred. Project costs include any costs incurred by the RAILROAD to facilitate design and construction of the 369.7 Bridge including engineering, materials, contract labor, RAILROAD labor, and other items related to the Project.

Upon completion of the Project, RAILROAD will submit to CITY documents confirming the actual cost of the Project, including either copies of requests for payment and amounts paid to contractor(s) or invoices of RAILROAD's costs, as applicable; CITY to provide reimbursement to RAILROAD within thirty days of RAILROAD's submission.

SECTION 3. <u>Cost Estimate for Bridge Construction</u>.

The estimated cost for the proposed 369.7 Bridge is \$1,122,000.

SECTION 4. Indemnification.

To the fullest extent permitted by law, CITY agrees to indemnify and hold harmless RAILROAD, its officials, agents, and employees and others working on behalf of RAILROAD, from and against any and all injury, loss, damage, claim, demand, action, cause of action, cost and expense, including any and all outlay and expense connected therewith, of every person or entity, including, but not limited to, employees, officers, or agents of the parties hereto, or from injury or loss of or damage to property of any kind or nature to whomsoever belonging, including loss of use thereof and, including, but not limited to, property owned by or in the care, custody, and control of the parties hereto, and for any damages which may be asserted, claimed or recovered against the RAILROAD by reason of, related to, or arising from the design of the Project.

SECTION 5. Channel Maintenance.

The CITY shall be responsible for the maintenance, including, but not limited to, debris removal, dredging, and rip-rap maintenance along Sugar Creek beneath the CITY's Sugar Creek Bridge, the RAILROAD's 369.7 Bridge, and those areas and locations upstream and downstream that may impact the 369.7 Bridge. The CITY shall notify RAILROAD before performing such work, and shall comply with railroad safety practices and operational requirements at the direction of the RAILROAD.



- 7. SE 37th ST East to Project






