On Item 1. Approval of Agenda

On Item 3. Approval of Minutes of October 6, 2016 Meeting

Greenwood stated that two corrections were made where Kelley's maiden name was incorrectly used. It was moved by Gatton to approve the minutes as previously amended. Freund seconded. Motion carried.

New Business:

On Item 5A. Update: Veterans Parkway / Great Western Trail

Ortgies shared that three meetings have been held so far between City staff and representatives of Warren County Conservation Board. Ortgies noted that the City is committed to finding alternatives to the original proposal. Christensen asked about the role of the Iowa Natural Heritage Foundation. Ortgies responded that they were involved with the trail's original development and acted as an advocate by writing a letter to the City. Ortgies added that Warren County Conservation is the key stakeholder and they are providing updates to INHF. France asked about when a decision will be made because there are outstanding maintenance items with the trail surface. Ortgies responded that discussions will continue until Warren County makes a recommendation to the Board of Supervisors. Gatton asked about when construction will begin. Petersen responded that the schedule is unknown at this time.

On Item 6B. Public Services

Cory shared a packet of sharrow information from the Des Moines MPO's Transportation Technical Committee. Cory added that there is some positive information about the safety impact of sharrows. Christiansen suggested that the sharrow information be included in an upcoming WDM Magazine article. Albertson expressed interest in use of wayfinding sharrows as shown in examples in the MPO materials.

Hansen shared staff is working on spring/summer 2017 programs. He added that there are three dates in particular that Commission members should have on their calendars: 5/11- National Bicycle Month Expo at Valley Junction Farmers Market, 5/13 - Mayors Bike Ride, and 6/3 – National Trails Day/Grand Opening Event for Art on the Trail

Ortgies shared that the budget approved by the Commission in October has been submitted to the Finance Department. Ortgies suggested potentially having the Des Moines MPO do topic specific mini-workshops at upcoming meetings. The commission expressed support for the idea.

1. Call to Order

The November 15, 2016 Roundtable meeting was called to order at 12:02 p.m.

- 5. DISCUSSION: Trail Harassment

Two members of the public shared their recent experiences of harassment on the trails related to e-bike use. These two were using the Bill Riley Trail in Des Moines when they were approached by another trail user, who told them it was illegal to use their e-bike on the trail. This user repeatedly accosted them, blocking their way and incorrectly stating that it is illegal to use e-bikes on the trail.

After the incident, these two people check the City of Des Moines website and City Council meeting minutes to determine if e-bikes are allowed, but found it difficult to get clear information.

One of the challenges of this issue is that there are different regulations depending on which jurisdiction the trail is in. This issue will be revisited in the near future with clarification from the lowa DOT and others to determine a way forward for a clearer regional solution. The Roundtable will also pursue avenues for better public communication of trail ordinances and rules for e-bikes on trails.

6. REPORT: Veteran's Parkway

Sally Ortgies of Parks and Recreation for the City of West Des Moines and Jim Priebe of the Warren County Conservation Board gave an update on the Veteran's Parkway project and potential impacts to the Great Western Trail. Since the last update, West Des Moines has included broader staff input into the process and has met with trail and user group representatives to discuss alternatives for the proposed road alignment.

West Des Moines staff indicated that there is great effort being made on the part of West Des Moines and Warren County to remain open and to work with interested parties while still keeping the project on schedule. There may be opportunities to better preserve or replace the Great Western Trail in many segments, though the area around Orilla poses some unique challenges.

Greater detail including specific proposed alignments will be made available in the near future and West Des Moines has committed to providing periodic updates on the project to the Roundtable.

7. REPORT: MPO Legislative Agenda

The MPO typically produces a list of regional transportation priority projects for the Greater Des Moines Partnerships legislative agenda and D.C. trip. This year, the MPO is expanding this list to include policies and a more comprehensive legislative agenda at the state and federal levels. Discussion was opened to the Roundtable to collect legislative priorities for the MPO. Potential priorities identified by the Roundtable included:

- Conservation funding
- lowa tax credits for conservation initiatives
- State Recreational Trail funding levels
- Safe passing law
- Consumer tax credits for bicycle purchases
- Idaho stop law
- Statewide e-bike clarification
