A. Veterans Parkway / Great Western Trail (Informational Item Only)

Wittstock provided background on the Microsoft Project Osmium and the Southwest Connector Study. He presented the Great Western Trail / Veterans Parkway alignment alternatives. Wittstock shared that the Warren County Conservation Board is currently receiving input and will make a recommendation to the Warren County Board of Supervisors at an upcoming meeting. He stated that the City of West Des Moines is involved because they have financing and want to build a road. He added that Warren County owns and operates the trail and will provide options to the WDM City Council. Chair Eddy reiterated to the audience that the presentation was an informational item only and that public comment would be received by Warren County on January 11 at 7pm at the Warren County Nature Center. France asked what distance of the trail would potentially be impacted. Wittstock responded that up to 1.6 miles could be impacted. Eddy stated that the WDM Bicycle Advisory Commission would not have an official role in the recommendation unless requested by WDM City Council. She encouraged Commission members and the audience to remain involved and to contact elected officials as citizens and as bicyclists.

The December 20, 2016 Roundtable meeting was called to order at 12:03 p.m.

- 5. DISCUSSION: Policies for Pedaling Report

Staff presented on a report by the Chaddick Institute of DePaul University called *Policies for Pedaling: Managing the Tradeoff between Speed and Safety for Biking in Chicago.* This report covered current trends in enforcement and policies around bicycling with a specific focus on the Idaho Stop law. The study examined behaviors at intersections throughout Chicago and found that currently the prevalent behavior is to follow Idaho Stop rules when approaching an intersection on bicycle. The authors recommend allowing Idaho Stops at intersections with fourway stops and further studying options at signalized intersections.

6. DISCUSSION: Iowa DOT Administrative Rule Chapter 165, Recreational Trails Program Review

Staff presented the proposed changes to the Iowa DOT Recreational Trails Program chapter from the Iowa DOT. Any comments or questions can be directed to Craig Markley at craig.markley@iowadot.us by January 9. The DOT summarizes the changes as:

- Removing and revising outdated language
- Adding definitions of terms used
- Clarifying that matching funds from other state agencies and programs and in-kind costs can be used for to match SRT funds
- Additions explanation of eligible costs is added

Provides extra points in scoring for "shovel ready" projects

The Roundtable discussed the changes with some notes made. The question was raised if onstreet projects would still be eligible for SRT funds. There were questions made about the definition of "shovel ready" and how the additional points could severely impact scoring, especially among smaller communities that may not be able to purchase ROW before applying for funding if that is included in "shovel ready." Finally, a concern was raised over the definition of recreational trail and funding eligibility for motor vehicle uses. The MPO will seek clarification from the lowa DOT on these questions and forward on concerns.

7. DISCUSSION: FFY 2021 STBG Program Public Comment

Staff updated the Roundtable on the STBG and STBG Set Aside process. STBG applications have been received and the project details and scoring are available on the MPO website. Public comment will be accepted throughout January through a public meeting, email, and an online input map. The projects will also be brought back to the Roundtable in January for any final comment.

The STBG Set Aside program, which has previously been title Transportation Alternatives Program, is changing due to FHWA guidance. In the past, MPOs were able to flex an amount from STP into TAP, usually around \$500,000. This money will now return to STP/STBG funds. However, the Funding Subcommittee has stated it will keep that money available for TAP-type projects in the future. This means that in future years, Set Aside/TAP projects will fill out both the Set Aside and STBG applications. The MPO will strive to make this as easy as possible, while maintaining our commitment to TAP projects. The Set Aside applications are not yet available. The Roundtable will be updated in the future with greater detail.

Warren County Conservation Board discussed their recent meeting on the Southwest Connector project and how it will impact the trail. The next public meeting will be January 11th, and Jim Priebe is still accepting public comment on the project.

The Roundtable also raised the question of how can we protect trails and linear parks in the future through policy or other means. This may be a future Roundtable item.

10. Project Updates

- INFH shared that they have protected over 6000 acres of land this past year.
- Preliminary work is being done to explore connecting the Raccoon River Valley Trail
 out to the Council Bluffs area.
- Urbandale's new trail is open near 100th Street and Meredith.
- The Prairie City Trail from Monroe to Mitchellville continues with work being done on the trailhead in Monroe.
- A marketing study has been completed for the Chichaqua Valley Trail.
- Bondurant is hosting a Chowder Winter Ride and the first piece of the Gay Lea
 Wilson Trail connection through Bondurant has been paved.
- There will be an Ames Bicycle Summit on February 17, the Roundtable is invited to attend.
- Des Moines is staking a route for the River Trail Phase 2 project.
- Altoona will bid the trail connection to Bondurant in March.

- The Bike Collective will have seven new bcycles and a new station in front of the downtown Hy-Vee in January.
- Also in January, on the 19th is the Safe Routes to School Conference and on the 20th is the lowa Bicycle Summit.
