West Des Moines City Council Proceedings Monday, July 10, 2017

Mayor Pro tem Rick Messerschmidt opened the regularly scheduled meeting of the City Council of West Des Moines, Iowa, in the Council Chambers of the West Des Moines City Hall on Monday, June 26, 2017 at 5:30 PM. Council members present were: R. Messerschmidt and R. Trimble. Council members J. Mickelson and J. Sandager participated via telephone.

City Clerk Ryan Jacobson stated staff is recommending that Item 5(a) Jordan Creek Business Park Specific Plan Amendment be continued to August 7, 2017.

On Item 1. Agenda. It was moved by Trimble, second by Messerschmidt approve the agenda as amended.

Vote 17-386: Messerschmidt, Mickelson, Sandager, Trimble...4 yes Motion carried.

On Item 2. Public Forum

Wendy Lacina, 537 2nd Street, stated she received a consent letter from the City regarding an upcoming phase of the Valley Junction Alley Improvements project that will impact the alley behind her home. She expressed concerns that the consent letter does not state whether her fence is on her property or the City's right-of-way and does not include an end date for the project, and suggested that those letters should provide that information. She noted she had recently reconstructed part of her fence after inquiring with the City and learning no permit would be needed, and since she perceived that response to indicate the fence was rightfully on her private property, she believes she is receiving conflicting information now that she is being told her fence sits on the City's right-of-way. She requested clarification from the City, and if the fence is in fact encroaching on the City's right-of-way, she would request restitution for the repairs she had recently done when she believed it was on her private property. She also expressed concerns about flooding that she believes could occur on her property as a result of this alley improvements project.

Claire Celsi, 4400 EP True Parkway, Unit 52, spoke in opposition to the City's ordinance allowing the use of fireworks on July 4th, citing concerns that children were using fireworks without supervision, fireworks were used outside of the allowed timeframe, and people were using fireworks unsafely. She also expressed concerns about fireworks-related injuries and structure fires, worsened air quality, and the negative impact to our community's quality of life. She requested the City Council consider a complete ban on the use of fireworks in West Des Moines.

Randle Boyd, 1351 South 51st Street, spoke in opposition to the City's ordinance allowing the use of fireworks on July 4th, citing concerns that fireworks were used outside of the allowed

timeframe, and the noise disturbed his quality of life and terrified his dog. He requested the City Council consider a complete ban on the use of fireworks in West Des Moines.

Davin Jones, 1427 South 50th Place, spoke in opposition to the City's ordinance allowing the use of fireworks on July 4th, citing concerns about the noise disturbing his quality of life and terrifying his dogs, fireworks were used outside of the allowed timeframe, and litter and debris from fireworks ended up on his property.

Nancy Boyd, 1351 South 51st Street, spoke in opposition to the City's ordinance allowing the use of fireworks on July 4th, citing concerns that it takes up significant time of the Police and EMS departments. She also expressed concerns about fireworks-related injuries, potential property damage, and the noise disturbing her quality of life.

Mayor Pro tem Messerschmidt stated the fireworks issue was handed down to cities by the Iowa Legislature, and there wasn't a lot of time to develop an ordinance, but the City Council sought a fair compromise with the ordinance allowing the use of fireworks on July 4th only. He noted the matter will be brought to the next meeting of the Public Safety Subcommittee for discussion about how to proceed.

Council member Trimble noted the community was deeply divided on the fireworks issue, and the compromise ordinance to allow the use of fireworks on July 4th only was essentially a trial run, and the City Council is now listening to all the feedback coming from residents to determine how to proceed.

Council member Sandager inquired about how the consultant was selected.

Sally Ortgies, Parks and Recreation Director, responded the City contracted with Confluence about a year ago to do a conceptual plan for the amphitheater. Now that there is partial funding for the amphitheater project, staff is requesting approval to hire a consultant to refine the conceptual design, and it makes logical sense to continue with Confluence since they have already done preliminary work for this project.

Brian Hemesath, Interim City Engineer, responded the acquisitions for Phase 1 of this project are nearly completed, and the acquisitions for Phase 2 are in progress. The construction of Phase 1 is scheduled to be bid later this month, so the underground work is expected to begin soon afterwards, which will require the closure of Ashworth Road from Jordan Creek Parkway to 81st Street. It will be reopened for the winter, and then closed again during the spring of 2018 for paving, and the construction of Phase 2 is also scheduled to occur in 2018.

On Item 6(a) Mayor Pro tem Messerschmidt indicated this was the time and place for a public hearing to consider Valley Junction Alley Improvements, Phase 4, initiated by the City of West Des Moines. He asked for the date the notice was published and the City Clerk indicated the notice was published on June 30, 2017 in the Des Moines Register. Mayor Pro tem Messerschmidt asked if any written comments had been received. The City Clerk stated none had been received.

Mayor Pro tem Messerschmidt asked if there were any public comments.

Wendy Lacina, 537 2nd Street, reiterated the comments she made earlier during the public forum portion of the meeting. Her concerns related to consent letters sent by the City for a different phase of the Valley Junction Alley Improvements project, which do not specify whether a resident's fence sits on their private property or the City's right-of-way and do not include an end date for the project. She also expressed concerns about flooding that she believes could occur on her property as a result of this alley improvements project.

Jack Hon, 212 7th Street, stated he also received a consent letter for a different phase of the Valley Junction Alley Improvements project, and he expressed concerns that the letter included an error with the property address.

Mayor Pro tem Messerschmidt asked if there were any additional public comments; hearing none he declared the public hearing closed.

Rod VanGenderen, Chief Building Official, stated there are no surveys done when a property owner obtains a fence permit, and he noted the permit applications state: "Confirming property lines, buried utilities, easements, restrictive covenants, or association requirements are strictly the responsibility of the owner and/or contractor."

Ms. Lacina inquired if the survey of her property line along the alley done for the Valley Junction Alley Improvements project could be made available to her.

Brian Hemesath, Interim City Engineer, responded the survey for Phase 4 has been completed and is available. However, the survey for the phase including the alley behind Ms. Lacina's home has not yet been completed. He stated he will reach out to Ms. Lacina to address all of her concerns.

Bret Hodne, Public Services Director, stated the surveys are being done for each phase of the Valley Junction Alley Improvements project so the City could define exactly where the property lines of the City's right-of-way are. He also addressed Ms. Lacina's concerns about flooding, stating the sump pumps should not back up water towards the home.

It was moved by Trimble, second by Messerschmidt to adopt Resolution - Approval of Plans and Specifications, Motion to Receive and File Report of Bids, and Resolution - Award Contract to Alliance Construction Group, LLC.
