West Des Moines City Council Proceedings Monday, February 05, 2018

Mayor Steven K. Gaer opened the regularly scheduled meeting of the City Council of West Des Moines, Iowa, in the Council Chambers of the West Des Moines City Hall on Monday, February 5, 2018 at 5:30 PM. Council members present were: R. Hardman, J. Mickelson, K. Trevillyan, and R. Trimble. Council member J. Sandager participated via telephone.

City Clerk Ryan Jacobson noted staff is recommending the swearing in of several Fire Department staff be postponed to the February 20th Council meeting.

On Item 2. Public Forum

Mayor Gaer read a statement on behalf of the City regarding a recent incident of alleged racial profiling at a retail store in West Des Moines. He stated the City of West Des Moines strives to provide and foster a safe and respectful environment for all and condemns any actions that discriminate or provide unfair treatment to any individual or group. He also highlighted a number of actions taken by the City towards that goal, including participation in the West Des Moines School District's community equity, diversity and multicultural conversation series, the work of the Human Rights Commission, and the proposed ordinance requiring non-discrimination language in contracts.

Julie Stauch, 4712 Westwood Drive, spoke about the recent incident of alleged racial profiling at a retail store, and she stated this is a community issue and called for the Mayor and Council to stand in opposition to such behavior. She expressed appreciation for the City's efforts on inclusivity and stated she hopes to see those efforts continue.

Carole Chambers, President/CEO of the West Des Moines Chamber of Commerce, provided an update on the organization's activities over the past year, noting their membership has increased by more than 25 percent.

On Item 9(a) Legislative Updates

Jamie Letzring, Deputy City Manager, reported staff had directed the City's lobbyist to register the City in support of HSB 552/SSB 3107, which addresses 911 emergency communication systems. The Mayor and Council agreed with that position.

Ms. Letzring also reported staff had directed the City's lobbyist to register the City as opposed to HF 2063, which would revise tax increment financing laws to the detriment of the City, and in favor of HF 2103, which would allow ground emergency transportation providers to receive supplemental reimbursements from the Federal Government for uncompensated care costs for Medicaid patients. The Mayor and Council agreed with that position.

Ms. Letzring also reported staff recommends the Council vote to register as opposed to HSB 568/SSB 3110, which addresses lease-purchase agreements. She stated the bill's current

language is very broad and could impede on the City's participation in public-private partnerships and economic development grants.

The Mayor and Council held discussion on HSB 568/SSB 3110 and agreed that, due to the ambiguity of the bill, the City should register as opposed.

Mayor Gaer stated that the City recently went through an RFP process for legal services, and Dorsey & Whitney, LLP has been retained for legal counsel regarding economic development and bond financing matters. He then invited attorneys Dave Grossklaus and John Danos to introduce themselves.

Mr. Grossklaus and Mr. Danos stated they are excited to serve the City as its legal counsel and look forward to working with the staff and elected officials.

It was moved by Sandager, second by Hardman to approve Motion - Direct Staff to Register the City as Opposed to HSB 568/SSB 3110
