The meeting of the West Des Moines Parks and Recreation Advisory Board was called to order on Thursday, March 15, 2018 at 5:31 p.m. by Chair Hrdlicka.

On Item 1. Approval of Agenda

Schebel moved to approve the agenda as presented. Ridgway seconded. Motion carried, 3 yes.

On Item 2. Citizen Forum

No items.

On Item 3. Approval of Minutes of February 15, 2018 Meeting

Schebel moved to approve the minutes as presented. Ridgway seconded. Motion carried, 4 yes.

On Item 4. Old Business

- A. Committee/Liaison Appointments
 - 1. Ridgway proposed officers for the Board as follows:
 - a. Chair Joe Hrdlicka
 - b. Vice Chair Heather Schebel
 - c. Secretary Aaron Sewell

Hrdlicka moved to maintain the Facilities Committee with Ridgway and Schebel serving, and also to maintain the Des Moines Trails and Greenways liaison as Sewell.

Ridgway moved to elect officers as proposed. Sewell seconded. Motion carried, 4 yes.

New Business

On Item 5A. Public Hearings

- A. Naming of Special Use Facility Nellie Phenix Legacy Commons
 - 1. Motion Approval of Recommendation to City Council.

Hrdlicka inquired when the notice was published and Ortgies responded March 9, 2018 in the Des Moines Register. Hrdlicka asked if staff had received any written comments and Ortgies responded that none had been received. Hrdlicka asked if there were any verbal comments from the public on this hearing. Hearing none, Hrdlicka declared the public hearing closed and opened up discussion among the members of the Board. Schebel shared that the neighborhood association had been active with this project. They took a

vote and proposed Nellie Phenix Legacy Commons as the name for the special use facility.

Ridgway moved to approve the recommendation to City Council for the Special Use Facility naming of Nellie Phenix Legacy Commons. Schebel seconded. Motion carried, 4 yes

B. Site Plan – Hidden Point Park

1. Motion - Approval of Recommendation to Planning and Zoning Commission.

Hrdlicka inquired when the notice was published and Ortgies responded March 9, 2018 in the Des Moines Register. Hrdlicka asked if staff had received any written comments and Ortgies responded none had been received. Hrdlicka asked if there were any verbal comments from the public on this hearing. Hearing none, Hrdlicka declared the public hearing closed and opened up discussion among the members of the Board. Ortgies shared there were approximately 20 people at the neighborhood meeting, and they were generally in support of the park and gave good feedback. The only item that was not decided upon was a pedestrian connection to the south into the Pheasant Ridge neighborhood. The plan will show this preliminarily, but it will not be included on the final site plan until the neighbors have provided their input. Sadler shared that the meeting was positive and there was good dialogue surrounding the park plan.

Ridgway moved to approve the recommendation to the Planning and Zoning Commission. Schebel seconded. Motion carried, 4 yes.

On Item 6A. New Business

A. Annual Report – Cricket League of Iowa
Adarsh Eppili from Waukee updated the Board on the league's 2017 Cricket season. Eppili
spoke on behalf of the league in sharing their interest to renew their lease with the City in 2020.

B. Discussion – Site Plan Concepts

1. Pinedale Park: Sadler shared that this area was unserved by parks up until Woodland West apartment complex completed a condominium conversion which triggered park land dedication. Sadler shared that it is a smaller site with plans for a sidewalk coming off of Woodland Avenue, a parking area, and a small shelter with a couple of benches. There will also be a sidewalk going to the north to a half-court basketball court. Staff will be removing old asphalt and adding new paving around the shelter along with two different age group playgrounds. The site plan is keeping all existing trees other than one evergreen. Staff has sent out approximately 300 notices to all residents in the area. Feedback from select neighborhood residents has been on the current functionality of the space and questions about what was to be expected in the future. Sadler added that other inquiries have come in, but nothing negative enough to warrant a neighborhood meeting similar to the one held for Whisper Point Park. Ridgway asked Sadler if this will be a park that the neighbors will feel welcome to use versus it feeling more like a park only for the condominiums. Sadler responded that based upon feedback, residents have expressed interest in the new park. Ridgway inquired about the demographics of the condominiums. Sadler did not know exactly but by observation he would estimate there's a fair share of young kids and families. Swalwell asked if there was an opening out of the park into the back yards in the area and Sadler responded there is a short chain link fence between the park and neighboring properties. Future plans include signage to inform the public that it is a City owned park.

2. Florer Park: Sadler shared that Florer Park is an older park and it was dedicated to the City in 1963 by the Florer Family. Currently there is some undesirable usage of the park, mainly because of the isolated location of the shelter towards the top of the hill. The new site plan will include a sidewalk connection at the north end and an extensive clean-up of the park. Two members of the Florer family have been included in the planning process. The deed requires there to be a shelter in the park, so the shelter will be moved closer to the horseshoe court area along with a small paved area complete with a bench with a plaque to recognize the Florer family. At the south end of the park the removal of two horseshoe courts will allow a new shelter to be incorporated. The removal of the two horseshoe courts meets the approval of Leroy Law, the City's contact for horseshoes. Hrdlicka asked how often horseshoes are played, and Ortgies replied during the summer it is weekly. There are also several tournaments that include the Iowa Senior Games. Ridgway inquired about the budget for the project, and Sadler replied \$100,000-\$110,000. Due to the current open space zoning, the setback requirements the setback requirements for the proposed shelter cannot be met. This is the reason for going through a formal re-zoning process to change the zoning to residential. Schebel asked if the family knew about the re-zoning. Sadler said he wasn't sure as this just came up recently. Hrdlicka asked if the enhancements will promote any undesirable behavior and Ortgies replied that moving the shelter to a new location and providing more lighting will hopefully help to deter undesirable activity. Swalwell mentioned that lighting at the top of the hill may be a positive addition to the park.

Staff Reports

On Item 7A. Superintendent of Parks

Sadler stated that construction has begun on portable toilet enclosures at Raccoon River Park, and a new shelter will be added near the fishing pier. Valley View Aquatic Center sandblasting and painting is almost finished. Woodland Hills Park loop trail, along with the basketball and tennis courts is out for bidding. There will be concrete trail renovations specifically along Westown Parkway to Jordan Creek Parkway, then along 60th Street along, and Westown Parkway to University. Sadler has been working with Engineering Services on park shelter, restrooms, and miscellaneous improvements in 17 different parks. The north pedestrian bridge at Pearson Park will be replaced. Seasonal Park attendants will be starting April 9th. Restroom and water startups are tentatively set for April 15th. Earth Day is April 21st, and there will be an event on the City Hall campus complete with grazing goats. The Shade Crusade tree pickup is April 28th. Residents have the opportunity to purchase trees at a discounted rate with the City providing 460 native trees for \$30 each. Ortgies stated that the West Des Moines Rotary Club is donating \$1,500 towards the Shade Crusade which is enough to purchase 50 trees to be planted on public property. Hrdlicka stated that he heard from a constituent and there is some debris on the east side of the trail entrance at Raccoon River Park. Sadler responded that he would have staff take a look and clean up what they can.

On Item 7B. Director of Parks and Recreation

Ortgies shared staff is overcoming the news of the LOSST election last week and is still forging ahead with the Five Waters Project. It may not happen as quickly as hoped but it is still a priority. Superintendent of Recreation interviews are scheduled for next Thursday and Friday. There were 68 total applicants and eight people are being interviewed in the first round. Seasonal hiring is moving along steadily, and the Department is still looking for lifeguards. There are currently 48 applicants, which is more than last year at this time. Brewick is going to talk to PE classes at various schools to help spread the word. Ortgies shared that staff has a temporary art sculpture planned to go in along Jordan Creek trail west of 50th Street. Hrdlicka followed up on the LOSST vote results by saying that the group

will pick up where they left off. Hrdlicka added that the state law is flawed and it's hard to get around. West Des Moines and Des Moines made a great effort to educate voters on the issue. Trimble added that completing these projects will be one of the most important things the Parks and Recreation Department does. Ortgies reminded everyone that the City will still be getting funds from the Dallas County LOSST vote which did pass. Hrdlicka said there was a success from this with the marketing materials prepared by Red Dot, and there's comfort in knowing that the citizens showed they do want these projects. Schebel added that the only bad feedback she received was that people couldn't trust how the money would be spent. Ridgway added that a bond referendum would take that concern away. Swalwell shared the benefit of a bond referendum is that if you get 60% of the vote, you can then get your projects done versus taking the time and effort to fundraise.

Public Hearing - Site Plan - Whisper Point Park

1. Motion – Approval of Recommendation to Planning and Zoning Commission

FINANCIAL IMPACT: None at this time

SYNOPSIS: Staff has been working with Civil Design Advantage to coordinate public outreach and design services required for Whisper Point Park. Initial concept plans were prepared in late 2017, public input was gathered, and the site plan for the park has been finalized. The board is asked to review the site plan, hold a Public Hearing, and make a recommendation to the Planning and Zoning Commission. A copy of the site plan is attached. All residents within 370 feet of the park were mailed invitations to the Board meeting, and a notice was also published in the Des Moines Register. Anyone present will have the opportunity to comment on the site plan during the Public Hearing and any written comments received prior to the Board meeting will be read. If approved by the Board, the site plan will be taken to the Planning and Zoning Commission and then to City Council for final approval.

BACKGROUND: Whisper Point Park is located on the NW corner of Bridgewood Blvd and 91st Street in the Whisper Ridge subdivision. This park was acquired through the parkland dedication process from this development with additional land to be added as the area develops to the west.

The initial concept plan was taken to the Board for discussion on January 18, 2018. Post cards were then mailed to area residents on January 25, 2018 soliciting input. Staff also presented the concept plan to the Facilities Committee on February 15, 2018 for more detailed review. Following substantial feedback from the public, staff then invited the area residents to a public input meeting which was held on March 6, 2018. Approximately 20 residents attended the public meeting, along with two Advisory Board members. Most of the initial concerns were addressed at that meeting, and several modifications were made to the plan in response to the feedback provided. Civil Design Advantage with staff's direction then refined the plan into a final site plan for the park as shown.

This item will be discussed by the Facilities Committee at their meeting on April 16, 2018.

Public Hearing - Rezoning - Florer Park

1. Motion – Approval of Recommendation to Planning and Zoning Commission

FINANCIAL IMPACT: No

None at this time

SYNOPSIS: The Board will hold a public hearing to take action on the rezoning request for Florer Park located at 1410 Locust Street in West Des Moines. The existing shelter in Florer Park is in need of replacement, and a plan has been prepared to install a new shelter in the park. Rezoning of the park from open space to residential land use is necessary to meet setback requirements for a new park shelter. The existing shelter will be removed and replaced with a new concrete pad and bench, and a new shelter will be located closer to the horseshoe courts.

The board is asked to hold a Public Hearing, and make a recommendation to the Planning and Zoning Commission. All residents within 370 feet of the park were mailed invitations to the Board meeting, and a notice was also published in the Des Moines Register. Anyone present will have the opportunity to comment on the site plan during the Public Hearing and any written comments received prior to the Board meeting will be read. If approved by the Board, the rezoning request will be taken to the Planning and Zoning Commission and then to City Council for final approval.

BACKGROUND: Florer Park was dedicated to the City in 1963 by the Florer Family, and as one of the City's oldest parks is in need of some upgrades. In recent years the park has had some undesirable activity, due somewhat to the isolated location of the shelter. Deed restrictions on the park require a shelter in the park, and staff has discussed shelter location with two members of the Florer family. The proposed plan is to locate a new park shelter farther south and incorporate into the existing horseshoe complex. This location was also requested by the users of the horseshoe complex, and will increase the visibility of the shelter from the adjacent Holiday Park roadway. A copy of the site plan is attached. This plan was brought to the Board for discussion on March 15, 2018.



The study has identified the need for a wifi antenna to be installed on the west side of Railroad Park. The antenna would be approximately 30 feet tall and would resemble a light pole (see attached image).



Motion - Approval of Temporary Public Art Installation - Jordan Creek Greenway

FINANCIAL IMPACT: None. The cost of the artwork and installation is being covered by Bravo Greater Des Moines and Group Creative Services.

SYNOPSIS: Staff was approached by Teva Dawson with Group Creative Services about a temporary public art project that is being sponsored by Bravo Greater Des Moines. The art work is a sculpture created by artist Alex Braidwood. It is related to water quality and communicates the nitrate levels in Jordan Creek using existing test results. Water testing of Jordan Creek has been done over the past year so has been made available to the artist. The artwork is proposed to be installed in a location along the Jordan Creek Trail just west of 50th Street (see attached map). The installation is temporary and is anticipated to be installed in early May and be in place through the summer.

The Public Arts Advisory Commission is responsible for approving all artwork installed on public property and approved the project at their February 22, 2018 meeting. Since that time the exact location and a draft contract have been finalized. Due to the location being on park property, the Board is asked to review and approve the proposed installation.



FINANCIAL IMPACT: If the request is approved as presented by the Iowa Premier League (IPL), there would be an impact of \$7,840 in lost revenue based on 27 Saturday rental days.

SYNOPSIS: Staff has met twice with the IPL with the Facilities Committee joining in on the second meeting. The IPL has communicated a concern with the amount of fees being charged for rental of field space at Valley View Park. They are also concerned about the availability of field space for the growing number of members in the league. The number of members provided to us by the league has varied from 350 to 400. At the conclusion of the last meeting with IPL, they were asked to provide a formal proposal outlining their requests.

An e-mail was received on March 21, 2018 with IPL's proposal. It is attached for your information. The Facilities Committee is meeting on April 16, 2018 to discuss the proposal and bring a recommendation to the full Board.

Hi Bruce,

Thank you for arranging the meeting with the Park Board Facilities Committee. We were quite encouraged by the discussion and consider this an opportunity to help grow our league. Based on what was discussed, we would like to propose the following:

IPL would like to formally enter a working agreement with the City of West Des Moines Parks and Recreation Department regarding the usage of Valley View Park facilities.

Field Usage [Valley View Park]:

• IPL (lowa Premier League) would use the Cricket field during the Spring, Summer and Fall months based on an agreed upon schedule that is disclosed to the city no later than April 15th of 2018.

- The field shall remain open for general public use and reservations by other sports outside of the times where reserved for IPL
- During these seasons, IPL would request the ground be reserved for IPL on all Saturdays (with Sunday as reserve days). See Fee Schedule for details

Field Maintenance:

- IPL will participate in the "Adopt a Park/Trail" program and will adopt the Valley View Park for two years (2018 and 2019) and extend it as permitted by the program
- IPL will continue to expect that the Department will undertake the maintenance of the Valley View Park (fertilizing, mowing, restrooms etc.).
- Any specific requests for additional maintenance shall be made 7 days prior to needing it.

Facilities and Improvements:

- IPL will be responsible for maintenance and repairs to the existing cricket "Pitch". The pitch shall be covered with astroturf or a similar material at IPL's expense.
- No additional structures or signage will be erected at the facility without the Department's consent.

Insurance Requirements:

- IPL shall at its cost and expense, procure and maintain casualty and liability insurance for the term of this Agreement.
- IPL would like to understand levels of required coverage and specific details for the policy as required by the city of west des Moines.

Fee Schedule:

- IPL will conduct its cricket activities in the following phases
 - Spring season (April June)
 - Saturday 9AM 6PM = 9 hrs [Schedule Play Day]
 - Sundays 9 AM 6 PM reserve day (if play not possible on Saturday)

Summer Season (June - August)

- Saturday 9AM 7PM = 10 hrs [Scheduled Play Day]
- Sundays 9 AM 7 PM reserve day (if play not possible on Saturday)

oFall Season (August-Oct)

- Saturday 9AM 6PM = 9 hrs [Scheduled Play Day]
- Sundays 9 AM 6 PM reserve day (if play not possible on Saturday)
- IPL will pay a fee of \$80 per each Scheduled Play Day and expect the fees to cover usage on the reserve day.
- On a regular agreed upon basis, IPL will disclose its current operating finances, schedules, plans and membership details (number of players, teams) to the City.

Short Term Vs Long Term:

- IPL proposes to enter this agreement on a short-term basis spanning the next three years (end of 2020 season)
- During this short-term, IPL would continue to grow the sport by engaging in various awareness and community activities including but not limited to the following
 - OAnnual Charity fundraisers to increase awareness of the sport and attract corporate sponsorship
 - o Conduct summer cricket camps for kids
 - oWork with various high school PE departments to help schools learn and enjoy this new sport
- At the end of this agreement period, IPL expects to be at a state of maturity where it can potentially meet the city's reservation fees at a higher capacity. These terms shall be reworked at that time.

Additional Ground Usage @ Wilson Park

- IPL proposes that Sundays be reserved at Wilson Park for IPL to schedule its games.
- IPL understands that there is a current agreement with HCL for Wilson Park usage and is willing to work with HCL to negotiate terms of usage.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: None at this time

SYNOPSIS: Staff is in the process of evaluating and prioritizing tennis and basketball courts for reconstruction as part of the annual court renovation program. Annual funding is expected to allow for renovation of 2 to 3 courts per year. Recently there has been a dramatic increase in the popularity of pickleball making it one of the fastest growing sports in the country. In response, several metro communities have recently converted some of their existing courts into dedicated pickleball courts. Retrofitting a tennis court allows for four pickleball courts with the same space. Currently there are three existing tennis courts that are striped to allow for pickleball, but no dedicated courts.

The Board is asked to consider whether at the time the court is due for renovation either a) any of the existing tennis courts should be converted into a dedicated pickleball court facility; and b) whether remaining tennis courts should be striped to also allow pickleball.

This item will be discussed by the Facilities Committee at their meeting on April 16, 2018.

BACKGROUND: There are currently 16 tennis courts with three of them planned for renovation with the next two years. In 2012, the tennis court in Jaycee Park was restriped to also accommodate a single pickleball court. Most recently, two lighted tennis courts with pickleball striping were installed in Valley View Park. The new tennis court being installed in Woodland Hills Park this summer is also being striped for pickleball.
