Meeting was called to order at 11:30 AM.

# 1. <u>Sewer Capital Charge</u> <u>Issue Summary:</u>

When a subdivision is platted in West Des Moines, a sewer capital charge of around \$1000 is collected for each lot to help pay for the capital cost of construction for improvements completed by the wastewater reclamation authority for the direct benefit of the city, and for interceptor, trunk and collection system improvements. When subdivisions are annexed into the City, the lots are not required to pay this charge at the time of annexation. If sewer becomes available to these subdivisions, code is not clear on whether the sewer capital charge should be collected. Staff is seeking direction on how to proceed with interpretation or a change in code for more clarity.

- a. Director Hodne detailed the strategy supporting a request which will minimize financial impact to Public Services Fleet by repurposing a vehicle slated for trade-in.
- b. Traffic Engineer Dickinson informed of a traffic code amendment to add a new stop sign on Valley West Drive at the S 34<sup>th</sup> Street intersection. This has been requested by citizens due to increased traffic from a new development.

b. City Engineer Hemesath showed visuals of capital improvement project signage used in the past. At the direction of City Manager Hadden and Deputy Manager Letzring, staff will reinstate the use of project signage with an updated look.

c. City Engineer Hemesath informed the Committee that Jeff Nash has assumed administrative responsibilities previously assigned to Brian Hemesath. Principal Engineer Nash's previous position will be posted. Director Hodne commended Engineer Nash for developing one of the best pavement management plans in the State of Iowa.

d. Director Hodne noted that Public Services is experiencing a staff shortage due to several retirements and the challenge of finding part-time staff to hire. Public Services will be reprioritizing work as needed to best utilize the existing employees, and will work hard to fill the vacated and two newly approved positions before winter.

e. City Engineer Hemesath updated the Committee on a cost increase from a change order to the Veterans Parkway Project – Maffitt Lake Road to Adams Street (0510-007-2018) project. City Council approved a change order for \$75,000 for the clean-up of the Smith Meats property. The Committee was previously informed that the projected remediation costs should stay below the \$75,000 amount. About \$22,000 was used on clean-up to what was above ground on Smith Meats. There were substantial buried items on that and other properties that drove the total amount to nearly \$100,000. An additional change order will be forthcoming. Finance Director Stiles added that with this increase the project is still significantly under budget.

f. City Engineer Hemesath informed the Committee that there would be a social media campaign developed by Parks & Rec Director Ortgies and Communications Specialist Stephenson to inform the public regarding Great Western Trail closings related to Veterans Parkway projects.

#### 4. Other Matters:

- a. Council Member Trevillyan asked for an update on the I-35 Bridge. City Engineer Hemesath responded that it is under construction with an expected completion date of spring 2019.
- b. Council Member Trevillyan asked whether utility locates are required on ROW permit applications. Utility locations are required to be notated. City Engineer Hemesath will investigate further how to best address shared use of ROW space.

The meeting adjourned at 12:26 PM. The next Public Services Council Committee meeting is scheduled for July 30, 2018.
