New Business

On Item 5A: Presentation – Windsor Heights Trail Connection Plans

Ortgies introduced Chadd Kahlsdorf, engineer, with the City's consultants Bolton and Menk. She stated that Kahlsdorf would provide a brief overview of the project, and an Engineering Committee meeting would be scheduled to review the plans in more detail. The results will be brought back to the full Commission at a future meeting. Kahlsdorf presented several connection options to the group. He stated that all options are feasible but cost and impact to adjacent properties would need to be considered. Ortgies stated that there are several goals of this project. One is to provide Windsor Heights residents access into West Des Moines, which was a request of their past mayor. The second goal is to give West Des Moines residents easier access to the Walnut Creek Trail. The third is to really look at how to better serve this part of the city with bike facilities.

On Item 5B: Presentation - Valley Junction Trail Connection Plans

Orgies stated that this project appears to be simple, but has challenges. The purpose of this project is to connect the Levee Trail into the Valley Junction area. Kahlsdorf shared that there have been numerous meetings with the Union Pacific Railroad and the Army Corp of Engineers to discuss the route for the trail. There is an existing trail near The Foundry that could be incorporated into the trail. Regarding the south portion, an agreement with the railroad for a crossing at South 11th Street should be finalized within the next couple of months. Once it has been approved, the project plans for this first phase can be completed and sent out to bid with construction beginning in spring of 2019. The north portion is still in the planning stages but could possibly be completed by the end of 2019. Suckow questioned why the trail could not cross the railroad tracks at South 9th Street. Kahlsdorf stated that it would be considered a new crossing and to do this would require the closing of 3 existing at-grade railroad crossings. Freund questioned if crossing South 9th Street twice was only so that the existing trail could be used or if following the street on the east side would be an option. Kahlsdorf stated cost is a factor, but this could be considered once the location of the railroad crossing on the north is determined.

Petersen stated all sharrows scheduled for Fiscal Year 17-18 are complete. Fiscal year 18-19 sharrows will be done in the spring. The Prairie View Drive bike lane from EP True Parkway to Pondarosa Drive was added to the future master plan for when the road is repaved. Ashworth Road west of Jordan Creek Parkway and Grand Prairie Parkway south of Raccoon River Drive will both have trails and are under construction. The Great Western Trail will be affected after October 1st due to construction, but will not be closed at any time. Intersection improvements at 1st Street and Railroad Avenue are primarily complete except for the crossing push buttons on the poles.

Alvarez stated the Woodland Hills Loop Trail is almost complete. Asphalt trail maintenance projects are occurring at Willow Springs Park, Peony Park, and portions of the Jordan Creek Trail. Knolls Greenway Trail had premature deterioration that will be addressed this fall by the contractor. Penning stated that the aquatic centers are closed. Illumifest is September 22 at the City Campus. Ortgies thanked everyone that attended the Ice Cream Social at Ashawa Park. Ortgies stated that the Grand Avenue Trail discussions are still occurring. A couple of options currently being considered are for the City to install a sidewalk on the west side instead of a trail or putting a trail on the east side of the street.

Resolution - Order Construction and Notice of Public Hearing on Plans, Specifications, Form of Contract, Estimate of Cost, and Direct Advertisement of Bids - Grand Avenue Trail, Fuller Road to Jordan Creek

FINANCIAL IMPACT: None at this time. The preliminary estimated cost of the project is \$245,949. Project expenses will be paid with budgeted funds in the Grand Avenue Trail, North of Fuller C.I.P. account (Project 0510 045 2016; G/L 500.000.000.5250.490). There is approximately \$488,000 available for these improvements.

BACKGROUND: A Bid Letting should be scheduled for 2:00 p.m. on Wednesday, October 24, 2018, and a Public Hearing on the project scheduled for 5:35 p.m. on Monday, October 29, 2018. The contract would be awarded on Monday, October 29, 2018, and work would begin shortly thereafter. This project should be underway this fall with final completion in spring 2019.

This Resolution is for the construction of 10' wide concrete trail within the street right-of-way of Grand Avenue between Fuller Road and connecting to the existing 4' sidewalk crossing the bridge over Jordan Creek. Project to include traffic control, excavation, storm sewer & utility adjustments, pavement removals, 6" reinforced concrete trail, new driveway approach, erosion control and site restoration.
