West Des Moines City Council Proceedings Monday, May 6, 2019

Mayor Steven K. Gaer opened the regularly scheduled meeting of the City Council of West Des Moines, Iowa, in the Council Chambers of the West Des Moines City Hall on Monday, May 6, 2019 at 5:30 PM. Council members present were: R. Hardman, J. Mickelson, K. Trevillyan, and R. Trimble. Council member J. Sandager K. Trevillyan participated via telephone.

City Clerk Ryan Jacobson stated there are three amendments to the agenda: Item 6(c) Bridgewood PUD Amendment has a revised item description, Item 6(e) Development Agreement with Fore Right, LC will be continued to May 20th, and Item 9(b) Legislative Updates is being removed from the agenda.

On Item 5(b) Amendment to City Code - Title 9 (Zoning), Chapter 5 (Agricultural/Open Space and Residential Zoning District) and Chapter 10 (Performance Standards) - Modify Garage Requirements and Establish a Waiver Process for Single-Family Detached Dwellings, initiated by the City of West Des Moines

Lynne Twedt, Development Services Director, reported the Development and Planning Subcommittee has recommended that the garage requirement should only apply to construction of new single-family homes, and all existing homes without garages would be grandfathered in. She also stated the separate policy staff is working on will include a deed restriction of five years.

Council member Trevillyan inquired if the garage requirement would be applied when a dilapidated garage is torn down as a nuisance violation.

Ms. Twedt responded that will be addressed in the separate policy as well, but the intent is that property owners in such cases would not be required to build a new garage, since they were unable to maintain the one they had.

It was moved by Trimble, second by Mickelson to consider the third reading of the ordinance.

Council member Trevillyan reiterated his opposition to the proposed ordinance, as he would prefer the garage requirement be deleted from the City Code entirely.

On Item 6(d) Mayor Gaer indicated this was the time and place for a public hearing to consider Mills Landing, southeast corner of South 60th Street and Mills Civic Parkway - Amend Comprehensive Plan Land Use Map and Approve the Mills Landing Area Development Plan, initiated by Shree Ram Development, LLC. He asked for the date the notice was published and the City Clerk indicated the notice was published on April 16, 2019 in the Des Moines Register. Mayor Gaer asked if any written comments had been received. The City Clerk stated on a vote of 6-0, with one member absent the Plan and Zoning Commission recommended City Council approval of the Comprehensive Plan amendment and Area Development Plan.

Mayor Gaer asked if there were any public comments.

Robert Brown, 903 Tulip Tree Lane, spoke in opposition to the proposed development project. He stated he has not yet seen a site plan for the project, and he expressed concerns about potential adverse impacts for the neighboring residents, such as building aesthetics, signage aesthetics, light pollution, and increased traffic volume.

Mayor Gaer noted the action being considered tonight is only addressing the comprehensive plan land use, and the applicant will have to submit a site plan for approval, which will include more specifics about the development project.

Sharon Mancero, President of the Glen Oaks Homeowners Association, spoke in opposition to the proposed change in land use for this property, citing concerns that commercial development would increase traffic volume and not be a good fit for this area.

Marianne Ksiazak, 917 Tulip Tree Lane, spoke in opposition to the proposed change in land use for this property, requesting that the City consider other uses for this property, such as mixed-use, as opposed to commercial.

Larry Hulse, 3825 Thornton Avenue, Des Moines, stated he owns a townhome east of this proposed development. He spoke in opposition to the proposed development project, citing concerns that the plans he saw indicated the setbacks would be significantly less than the existing townhomes. He also expressed concerns about potentially inadequate transitions from residential to commercial use and negative impacts to the residential properties from light pollution and dumpster location.

Ze-Hui Han, 5518 Little Leaf Trail, stated he owns a rental property near the proposed development. He spoke in opposition to the proposed development project, stating he believes a detailed plan should be made available to the public before a decision is made on this proposed item. He also expressed concerns about potential negative impacts to the surrounding property values.

John Schneller, 5542 Little Leaf Trail, spoke in opposition to the proposed development project, expressing that he believes there is already too much commercial development along Mills Civic Parkway, and he expressed concerns about traffic volume.

Mayor Gaer asked if there were any additional public comments; hearing none he declared the public hearing closed.

Lynne Twedt, Development Services Director, responded to questions from the Council, clarifying that the proposed action tonight would only change the comprehensive plan land use for the property and approve the area development plan, which is the first step before a specific plan, but this action does not establish any zoning. She stated staff is currently drafting the specific plan ordinance, which will establish more specific details for the development such as buffering, setbacks, and building size. She noted the proposed project would call for rezoning the property to support commercial, which could still include some residential uses mixed with commercial. There is also a potential senior living facility project that could be developed on the southern part of this property, which would likely require another comprehensive plan amendment, area development plan, and specific plan ordinance. She also stated after the zoning ordinance is adopted, the applicant would still need to get the site plan approved.

Mayor Gaer stated that if the Council approved the comprehensive plan land use change for the property, they are essentially obligating themselves to approve the zoning change as well. However, he also noted the residents will have more input on the proposed development as part of the specific plan ordinance process, than if a multi-family residential development project were to come forward under the current zoning.

Ms. Mancero stated she would prefer any form of residential development allowed under the current zoning over any form of commercial development, as she believes a commercial development would negatively impact property values of the surrounding homes and disrupt the neighborhood's way of life.

Mayor Gaer suggested that the comprehensive plan amendment and area development plan should be deferred and brought forward with the specific plan ordinance, so the neighboring residents can have a better idea of what the development project might look like.

Ms. Twedt stated the specific plan ordinance is expected to come forward soon, possibly at the June 3, 2019 meeting.

Council member Trimble suggested that the applicant meet with the residents prior to the June 3rd meeting and provide as much detail as possible about the proposed development.

Sally Ortgies, Parks and Recreation Director, responded that, unlike Valley View Park, Whisper Point Park is a neighborhood level park intended to serve the residential area immediately surrounding the park.

Council member Trevillyan stated he will not support this, as he believes since Valley View Park is so close, Whisper Point Park should be developed as a mini park.

He stated staff intends to seek competitive quotes for each phase individually, starting with the grading portion, because that will address the immediate safety concerns. On Item 9(a) Des Moines Area Regional Transit Authority (DART) Route Changes

Elizabeth Presutti, Chief Executive Officer of DART, and Amanda Wanke, Chief External Affairs Officer of DART, presented information on proposed route changes for the routes that impact West Des Moines, including Local Route 11, Flex Route 72, Local Route 52, Express Route 94, Express Route 95, and Express Route 96. They noted these proposed changes will be cost neutral and seek to improve efficiency of the transit system. They also responded to questions from the Council, stating the areas including Edgewater and DMACC West Campus are not currently served by DART due to not enough density. However, DART is looking at short, medium, and long-term options to provide some level of service for those areas, especially since demand will increase after the Des Moines University campus relocates to that area. They also stated two public information meetings have been scheduled for May 13th and May 21st to discuss the proposed route changes in West Des Moines.

Council member Hardman requested staff provide information on the Police Week activities scheduled for next week.

Police Chief Chris Scott reported an open house and community picnic will be held at the Law Enforcement Center on Thursday, May 16th. He also reported on May 16th, a ceremony will be held in conjunction with the placement of a headstone at the grave of Anthony Swatta, who was the first West Des Moines police officer killed in the line of duty.
