Monday, June 3, 2019

Mayor Steven K. Gaer opened the regularly scheduled meeting of the City Council of West Des Moines, Iowa, in the Council Chambers of the West Des Moines City Hall on Monday, June 3, 2019 at 5:30 PM. Council members present were: R. Hardman, J. Mickelson, J. Sandager, K. Trevillyan, and R. Trimble.

City Clerk Ryan Jacobson stated staff is recommending the agenda be amended to continue Public Hearing Item 6(d) Development Agreement with Fore Right, LC indefinitely.

On Item 2. Public Forum

Brian Hemesath, City Engineer, noted the previous property owner had raised the same concerns to staff, and the developer and engineer for the development were made aware of those issues. He stated the Thomas property and those around it are all private property, so the City is not responsible for these issues, but staff will help by providing information to them and facilitating the conversation with the developer and the engineer.

Council member Trimble reported he, along with the Mayor and some of his fellow Council members, attended the news conference at the location of the new Des Moines University campus, and he expressed excitement for the addition of their campus to West Des Moines.

Joe Carver, 4320 Ashworth Road, spoke in opposition to the proposed ordinance, stating he parks his vehicles along this segment of 44<sup>th</sup> Street. He also expressed concerns that he did not receive notification of this proposed change.

Bret Hodne, Public Services Director, reported this proposed ordinance was driven by complaints regarding traffic safety, as it can be difficult for vehicles to turn onto 44<sup>th</sup> Street when vehicles are parked along the street and waiting at the stop sign. He noted 75 feet is usually the shortest distance of a no parking zone imposed by the City.

Council member Trimble stated he has personally witnessed the traffic safety issue at this intersection. He inquired if it would be possible to impose a no parking zone that is less than 75 feet.

Council member Trevillyan suggested this item be continued for four weeks to allow staff to research the issue and bring it back to the Public Services Subcommittee for further discussion.

Susanne Gerlach, Public Financial Management, 801 Grand Avenue, Des Moines, reported the City's 'AAA' bond rating was recently affirmed by S&P Global Ratings, which helped these bond issuances receive quality bids. She also reported the City tried a new approach to the bond sales today with each sale occurring 15 minutes apart, which she believes further improved the bids received. She then presented the tabulations of bids for the four bond issuances. Series 2019A received five bids, which included 32 bidders that went in as syndicates. The low bid, submitted by Hutchinson, Shockey Erley & Co., came in at a true interest rate of 1.63 percent. Series 2019B received six bids, which included 33 bidders that went in as syndicates. The low bid, submitted by Raymond James & Associates, came in at a true interest rate of 1.51 percent. Series 2019C received four bids, which included 31 bidders that went in as syndicates. The low bid, submitted by Hutchinson, Shockey Erley & Co., came in at a true interest rate of 1.98 percent. Series 2019D received four bids, which included 31 bidders that went in as syndicates. The low bid, submitted by Fifth Third Securities, Inc., came in at a true interest rate of 1.49 percent.

Mayor Gaer requested that staff distribute the S&P report regarding the recent rating review, and he inquired if the State's property tax reform bill had any impact on their confidence in the City's 'AAA' bond rating.

Ms. Gerlach noted the rating agencies regarded the property tax reform bill as neutral, since the limitations from the earlier versions were removed before it passed.
