ITEM: Motion – Approval of Recommendation to City Council - Sidepath/Trail

Crossings at Street Intersections

FINANCIAL IMPACT: None at this time.

**SYNOPSIS:** Over the last few years, staff has received multiple requests to install mini-sized stop signs or yield signs on sidepath trail approaches at various street crossings. In these cases, Staff typically would then meet on site with the residents at the select crossing, and discuss each location on a case by case basis. Staff requests that the full Commission discuss this item and approve a formal recommendation to the City Council.

Staff is recommending that no signs be installed on trails at controlled street intersections for the following reasons:

- 1. The signs are not enforceable as pedestrians (including bicyclists on trails) would still have the right-of-way as per state law.
- 2. The presence of stop signs for both drivers and trail users could lead to confusion.

  Drivers may mistakenly believe they have the right-of-way at the trail crossing and that bicyclists will be stopping.
- 3. In other cities where signs are installed on trails, such as along Hickman Road in Waukee, a number of bicyclists do not obey these signs.
- 4. The signs would produce additional sign clutter and long-term maintenance implications due to the hundreds of trail crossings and thousands of sidewalk crossings in the City.

Staff is recommending that mini-stop signs or yield signs continue to be installed on trails at midblock crossings as these are uncontrolled intersections with no stop sign for vehicles on the street.

**BACKGROUND:** This topic and a few of the individual cases came before the Engineering Committee on 2/12/18. The Engineering Committee was in agreement with staff's recommendation and reported back to the full Commission on 3/1/18. No action was taken by the Commission at that time.

**RECOMMENDATION:** Approve staff's recommendation to not install stop or yield signs on trails at controlled street intersections.
