Meeting was called to order at 11:32 AM by City Engineer, Brian Hemesath.

## 1. 905 S 60th Street Sanitary Sewer Service Exemption (JN)

## Issue Summary:

Steve Caseley of 905 S. 60th Street is requesting a City Code exemption to repair his existing septic system in lieu of trying to connect his sanitary service to the City sewer on his property or to the City sewer that is on the north adjacent property.

In March 2020, Mr. Caseley's existing septic system was inspected by Dallas County and failed the inspection. Mr. Caseley stated he would like to sell his property; however, Iowa Code requires properties to have septic systems in working order or the service be connected to a sewer system before new ownership can be transferred.

The City Code states for properties with failed septic systems, the property owner need to connect their sanitary service to the available City sewer on the property or City sewer within 400' of the property line.

The City sewer on Mr. Caseley's property crosses his driveway 650' to 700' from his house. This service would need to cross a creek for the connection.

The City sewer on the north adjacent property (6340 Stagecoach Drive) is 175' to 200' from Mr. Caseley's house. This City sewer is approximately 35' from Mr. Caseley's north property line. Mr. Caseley would need to obtain an easement from the adjacent property owner to connect this service.

Mr. Caseley hired a plumber (Roger's Septic system) to provide him estimates for connecting to the two City sewer main options and for repairing his septic system. Below are the plumber's estimates.

- 1. Approximately \$50,000 to connect Steve Caseley's service to the City sewer main crossing the driveway on his property.
- 2. Approximately \$4,000 to connect Steve Caseley's service to the City sewer on the adjacent property if an easement could be obtained.
- 3. Approximately \$10,000 to repair Steve Caseley's existing septic system.

Steve Caseley would prefer to obtain an easement from the north adjacent property owner; however, they want him to purchase a triangle section of their property or have him sell his property outright to them instead of purchasing just a service easement. Steve Caseley states he does not want to purchase the triangle section from the adjacent property owner or sell his property to them. He just wants to purchase an easement from the adjacent property owner for his service connection.

The staff's position would be for Steve Caseley to connect his sanitary service to the City sewer on the adjacent north property if an easement could be reasonably obtained. However, if this option is not available, staff recommends allowing Steve Caseley to repair his septic system in lieu of connecting his service to the City sewer crossing his property that is 650' to 700' from his house.

<u>Direction</u>: Committee members were in agreement with Staff's recommendation for an exemption allowing Mr. Caseley to repair his existing septic system in lieu of trying to connect his sanitary service to the City sewer on his property or to the City sewer that is on the north adjacent property.
