Meeting was called to order at 11:30 AM by City Engineer, Brian Hemesath.

## 1. Ginger West Update (JMS/BJH)

## Issue Summary:

Microsoft announced on October 6, 2020 that they have plans to build two new data centers in West Des Moines. Ginger West is located just west of South Grand Prairie Parkway in between Booneville Road and Raccoon River Drive. Ginger East is located in between IA-5 and SE County Line Road from Veterans Parkway to SE Soteria Avenue near Microsoft's existing Alluvion data center.

City Staff are currently making plans to complete the projects identified on the Ginger West and Ginger East exhibits. These improvements include various bridges and culverts including an overpass on South Grand Prairie Parkway over Raccoon River Drive and the Iowa Interstate Railroad. Conveyance Improvements along Johnson Creek (the western of the two major drainageways) and Sugar Creek (the eastern of the two major drainageways) near Ginger West are also being considered as sources of fill material for roadway construction.

Microsoft plans to break ground on their new sites in Fall 2021. Paving Booneville Road, constructing a looped water system, and extending sanitary sewer are of primary importance in 2021. This will involve a lot of mass grading to ensure that utilities are not initially installed too deep. This will be immediately followed up with commencement of construction of several of the bridges identified, most likely mid to late 2021. Paving of several of the major roadways will most likely take place in 2022, again along with mass grading. Paving of some of the minor roadways will tail into 2023.

## 2. Raccoon River Sanitary Sewer Fee District (BJH)

#### Issue Summary:

City Staff was asked to review the fees for the Raccoon River Sanitary Sewer Fee District located south of the Raccoon River and west of I-35. The per acre fee is much higher than others in the City. Staff engaged Veenstra & Kimm (V&K) to review the area and see if there were ways to expand the area to lower the cost.

The proposal from the V&K analysis included adding acreage to the Raccoon River Sanitary Sewer Fee District to the south and included additional infrastructure to serve the expanded area. Since the number of developable acres increases significantly, the fee was lowered about 32%. The expansion of the infrastructure extends into area of future Cumming jurisdiction so coordination with City of Cumming will need to occur prior to the fee district being amended. Staff recommended moving forward with a new fee structure for the Raccoon River Sanitary Sewer Fee District.

There are a few lots in Maffitt Estates, located within this fee district, where the sanitary sewer fees have already been paid City Staff has been collecting the fee based on the current ordinance and discussed the possibility of refunding the difference to those homeowners who have paid the higher sanitary sewer fee.

The final plat for The Preserve Estates development by Knapp is planned on going to the 11/16 City Council meeting for approval. As part of that approval, Knapp is required to pay their sanitary sewer fee district fee. Staff recommended that Knapp pay the current fee and when the fee district amendment is approved by City Council, the difference can be refunded at that time or be applied to a future Knapp development in that district.

<u>Direction:</u> Committee members were supportive of Staff moving forward with expanding the Raccoon River Sanitary Sewer Fee District per the V&K analysis. The Committee was supportive of Staff recommendation of Knapp paying the current fee district fee with a future refund. Engineering Services and Legal will determine the best way to make this happen.

## 4. Staff Updates:


- Bret Hodne, Public Services Director mentioned that Staff has been dealing with a few minor winter


### 5. Other Matters:
