Monday, October 19, 2020

Mayor Steven K. Gaer opened the regularly scheduled meeting of the City Council of West Des Moines, Iowa, in the Council Chambers of the West Des Moines City Hall on Monday, October 19, 2020 at 5:30 PM. Council members present were: R. Hardman, G. Hudson, M. McKinney, K. Trevillyan and R. Trimble.

City Clerk Ryan Jacobson stated there is one amendment to the agenda, as the applicant for Item 7(c) M&W Mini Storage Site Improvement Plan has requested the item be continued two weeks. He also noted there have been amendments to the drawings associated with Item 7(e) Parcel 2020-158 Plat of Survey.

On Item 1. Agenda. It was moved by Trimble, second by Hardman approve the agenda as amended.

On Item 2. Public Forum

Jan Fleming, 1800 Grand Avenue, #259, addressed the council regarding her concerns about the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and how some people are not wearing face coverings or practicing social distancing in public places, such as grocery stores and in the common areas of her apartment complex. She requested the City take further steps to mitigate the spread of the virus, such as issuing a mask mandate.

Mayor Gaer stated the City has adopted a Resolution encouraging COVID-19 public health practices, but that is the extent of the City's authority on this issue, as the Iowa Attorney General has written a legal opinion that only the Governor can legally issue a mask mandate. He encouraged Ms. Fleming to share her concerns with the Governor's office, and the specific concerns about her apartment complex should be shared with her landlord.

On Item 3. Council/Manager/Other Entities Reports:

Council member McKinney reported he attended a meeting of the Bravo Greater Des Moines Board, where discussion was held on budgetary concerns amidst the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic and potential changes to how the organization allocates funding. The changes could decrease or eliminate funding allocations for some organizations that don't have arts and culture as part of their primary mission, such as the Historic Valley Junction Foundation. He also reported the Development and Planning Subcommittee met and discussed increased flexibility within the City Code. He also attended a meeting of the Metropolitan Advisory Council, where an update was given by the Polk County Housing Trust Fund.

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Council member Hudson reported he attended the annual meeting for the Greater Dallas County Development Alliance.

Council member Trimble reported he attended a meeting of the Polk County Disaster Recovery Committee, which seeks to provide assistance to the public and businesses during the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. He also attended a meeting of the Finance and Administration Subcommittee, where discussion was held on the upcoming budget process and potential adjustments to the allocation of hotel/motel tax funding and local option sales tax revenue.

Council member Hardman reported she attended a meeting of the Human Rights Commission, where discussion was held on planning the commission's Martin Luther King Jr. Day celebration. She also reported there will be a ribbon cutting ceremony for the West Des Moines Public Library's new kiosk in Valley Junction.

Mayor Gaer reported he received a letter notifying him that the City of West Des Moines was again awarded the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting by the Government Finance Officers Association.

Council member Trimble he reported a meeting of the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board, where discussion was held on alcohol usage policies and the proposed single track trail in Southwoods Park.

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Mayor Gaer noted the Council has received a memo from staff regarding this item, as the applicant has reconfigured the lot lines for this plat of survey.

City Attorney Scieszinski noted another amendment is the additional right-of-way needed could be acquired through an easement, as opposed to fee title only, as permitted by the City's exaction policy for right-of-way acquisition in established areas.

Council member Trimble expressed concerns about the City having less control over utilities that are placed in the right-of-way, if the City only controls it through an easement. He stated he would prefer to have the property owner sign an irrevocable offer of right-way-dedication, as opposed to the easement.

Mayor Gaer expressed concerns that Council member Trimble's suggestion would be inconsistent with the City's policy.

Council member Trimble requested that staff write the easement so that the City has as much authority as possible over utilities placed in the right-of-way and will not be responsible for the cost of relocating private utilities if necessary in the future.

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On Item 7(g) Xcaret Club and Lounge, LLC d/b/a Xcaret Club and Lounge, 2700 University Avenue, Suite 200 - Class LC Liquor License - Renewal

City Attorney Dick Scieszinski provided a report on the background history of this liquor license. He stated, in 2018, Jorge Sanchez initially applied for the license as the sole owner, but the City denied his application due to multiple criminal violations that were not disclosed on his application. Maria Mendoza, the wife of Jorge Sanchez later applied as the sole owner and provided a written statement that her husband would have no further involvement in the ownership of the establishment. Her application was approved with the understanding that if Mr. Sanchez is found to have more involvement than indicated by her written statement, that would be grounds for denial of any renewal application in the future. It has become evident that Mr. Sanchez has been intimately involved with the banking and financial activities for the establishment. Additional reasons for the staff recommendation to deny this renewal application include: the establishment denied entry to a West Des Moines Police Officer, the establishment has been cited by the Iowa Alcoholic Beverages Division for violating the Governor's proclamation requirements for social distancing, and since the liquor license was issued in 2018, no sales tax payments have been made on behalf of Xcaret. Both Jorge and Maria have been charged with five counts each of tax evasion, with Jorge also charged with fraudulent practice in the first degree. Although the charges are pending, probable cause exists to believe these crimes were committed.

Billy Mallory, 6701 Westown Parkway, Suite 100, representing the applicant, stated the LLC has been owned solely by Ms. Mendoza since 2018, which can be verified through Iowa Secretary of State filing records. He stated Xcaret Club and Lounge has a policy allowing the Police Department to enter at any time, and they have been inside the establishment. He acknowledged the establishment did receive a citation for violating social distancing requirements, but he noted many other establishments have also received such citations. He stated the failure to pay sales tax was due to the learning curve of Ms. Mendoza as a first-time business owner who is also learning English as a second language, and he noted those issues are being addressed. He stated the allegation that Mr. Sanchez is writing all the checks for the business is not true, as the checks written by Mr. Sanchez were for his businesses in Marshalltown, which shared a bank account with Xcaret Club and Lounge. He noted that Ms. Mendoza has since established a separate bank account for Xcaret Club and Lounge with only her name on the account. He noted he believes Xcaret Club and Lounge and Ms. Mendoza both meet the Iowa Administrative Code criteria for holding a liquor license, and he requested that the City Council approve this liquor license renewal application.

Mr. Scieszinski inquired when the separate bank account for Xcaret Club and Lounge was established.

Mr. Mallory responded it was established on October 15, 2020.

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Mr. Scieszinski noted the written statement submitted by Ms. Mendoza with her 2018 application stated: "I will have a bank account for all profits or revenues derived from Xcaret Club and Lounge, LLC under my name and I will be the only one person under the bank account."

Mr. Mallory stated all the profits have been going to Ms. Mendoza since the beginning. He acknowledged the separate bank account should have been established sooner, but he stated Ms. Mendoza was not well-versed on the rule of law and the operation of business.

Mr. Scieszinski stated ignorance of the law is no excuse, and since Ms. Mendoza is in business, she is held to a certain standard. He noted Ms. Mendoza has also failed to pay sales tax since 2018, and he inquired when she started making sales tax submissions.

Mr. Mallory responded they started making sales tax submissions a couple weeks ago, as soon as they became aware of what needed to happen.

Mr. Scieszinski inquired if Mr. Mallory is denying that Xcaret Club and Lounge refused the West Des Moines Police Department permission to enter the establishment.

Mr. Mallory responded yes, he is denying that the establishment ever denied access to anyone from the West Des Moines Police Department. He noted there was one occasion where someone working front door security inquired as to the rationale why the police were there at that point in time, but that individual is no longer with the business. He stated there is no policy that says the police can't come in the business.

Jessica Spoden, Assistant City Attorney, stated she has been in contact with the Iowa Alcoholic Beverages Division, who had been conducting the investigation regarding Mr. Sanchez's involvement with the business, and they had provided the City with the copies of the checks written by Mr. Sanchez. She also noted the bank account for those checks is associated with a Square account that is solely under the name of Jorge Sanchez. She also stated she has confirmed the sales tax permit for Xcaret Club and Lounge was established on October 8, 2020. She responded to questions, stating the incident when the West Des Moines Police Department was denied access to the establishment occurred on June 11, 2020.

Council member McKinney stated Ms. Mendoza should have known that the alcohol sales business is highly regulated. He also referenced the Iowa Administrative Code criteria for holding a liquor license requires prompt payment of local and state taxes, which has not occurred in this case, as well as a good reputation, which he believes is questionable, because Ms. Mendoza has contradicted her sworn statement, denied a police officer access to the establishment, and violated the Governor's proclamation on social distancing.

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Mayor Gaer noted the license was reluctantly granted in 2018, so he feels Ms. Mendoza should have received the message that she needed to ensure her establishment was in full compliance with all the applicable laws and requirements.

Council member Hardman inquired if staff conducts an exhaustive search on sales tax compliance when reviewing these applications.

Mr. Scieszinski responded staff conducts a thorough review on applications, but it does not include an exhaustive search on sales tax compliance. In cases like these, the City is notified by the Iowa Alcoholic Beverages Division if there is an issue.

Mr. Mallory stated the City had approved a renewal of this liquor license in 2019, yet some of the issues being pointed out at this time pre-date that renewal.

Police Chief Chris Scott explained that the review for a renewal application does not include research on sales tax compliance. They do research arrest records, trip loads, and any history of violations at the establishment. The 2019 renewal for Xcaret Club and Lounge was recommended for approval because the City had no knowledge of the sales tax issues at the time and the research on the other matters did not uncover any disqualifiers. He stated the tax issues were recently uncovered by the Iowa ABD investigation and then brought to the attention of the City. The Iowa ABD does not have law enforcement powers, so they collaborated with the West Des Moines Police Department so they could press charges against the business.

It was moved by Trevillyan, second by McKinney to adopt Motion - Denial of Liquor License Application.
