West Des Moines City Council Proceedings Monday, October 4, 2021

Mayor Steven K. Gaer opened the regularly scheduled meeting of the City Council of West Des Moines, Iowa, in the Council Chambers of the West Des Moines City Hall on Monday, October 4, 2021 at 5:30 PM. Council members present were: R. Hardman, G. Hudson, M. McKinney, K. Trevillyan and R. Trimble.

City Clerk Ryan Jacobson stated staff is recommending the agenda be amended to remove Item 4(g) Contract Agreement - Snow Removal and Ice Control Services for Sidewalks and Crossing Guard Areas.

On Item 1. Agenda. It was moved by Trimble, second by Hardman approve the agenda as amended.

Mayor Gaer stated a letter was received earlier today from Mediacom objecting to Items 4(i)1 and 4(i)2.

On Item 2. Public Forum

Milton Cole-Duvall, 2001 South 40<sup>th</sup> Court, commended the City for terminating its contract with The Conley Group, Inc. for City Hall building security services and for hiring Audrey Kennis as the City's first Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Director.

## On Item 3. Council/Manager/Other Entities Reports:

Council member McKinney reported he attended a meeting of the Bravo Greater Des Moines Board, and the organization announced the recipients of its second round of grants for 2021; however, he noted the availability of grant funding will be limited going forward. He also attended a meeting of the Metropolitan Advisory Council, where discussion was held on the Central Iowa Code Consortium. He also reported he attended the Raccoon River Rally, hosted by the West Des Moines Chamber of Commerce, and the grand opening of the MidAmerican Energy RecPlex, both which were great events.

Council member Trimble congratulated the West Des Moines Chamber of Commerce for doing a phenomenal job hosting the Raccoon River Rally. He also congratulated the Parks and Recreation Department for hosting the grand opening of the MidAmerican Energy RecPlex.

Council member Hudson spoke in support of regional collaboration efforts, such as the Central Iowa Code Consortium, because it pays huge dividends, as a metropolitan community is only as

strong as its weakest link.

Council member Hardman congratulated the West Des Moines Chamber of Commerce hosting a successful Raccoon River Rally, the Parks and Recreation Department for hosting the grand opening of the MidAmerican Energy RecPlex, and the Human Services Department for hosting another successful Sunday Supper in our Town fundraiser. She reported she also attended a meeting of the Historic West Des Moines Master Plan Steering Committee, where discussion was held on a potential project on 5<sup>th</sup> Street. She also thanked Police Chief Chris Scott for meeting with a resident regarding a situation.

Mayor Gaer reported he attended an oath of office ceremony at the Police Department today, where he had the privilege of swearing in a new Police Officer.

Brian Hemesath, City Engineer, responded the entire project is still expected to be completed by the completion date, as other phases of the project are ahead of schedule and will meet their deadlines. This particular phase, which was already behind schedule, will be rebid at a later date. He noted the City and the contractor are mutually agreeing to terminate the contract.

The City Clerk stated on a vote of 6-0, with one member absent, the Plan and Zoning Commission recommended City Council approval of the comprehensive plan amendment.

Council member McKinney inquired if the surrounding property owners are aware of their financial responsibility regarding the larger sanitary sewer that will be needed for this area.

Lynne Twedt, Development Services Director, responded the three developers in the area are aware of the situation. She noted the requirement will be included in the resolution, which will be recorded so that it would come up in a title search for those properties.
