West Des Moines City Council Proceedings
Monday, August 1, 2022

Mayor Russ Trimble opened the regularly scheduled meeting of the City Council of West Des Moines, Iowa, in the Council Chambers of the West Des Moines City Hall on Monday, August 1, 2022 at 5:30 PM. Council members present were: R. Hardman, G. Hudson, D. Loots, M. McKinney, and K. Trevillyan.

On Item 1. Agenda. It was moved by Trevillyan, second by Loots approve the agenda as presented.

On Item 2. Public Forum:

Robert Greenway, 417 7th Street, Menlo, stated he is moving to Granger, and he is running for Dallas County Supervisor. He also stated one of his objectives is a petition to increase the number of Dallas County Supervisors from three to five.

On Item 3. Council/Manager/Other Entities Reports:

Bret Hodne, Public Services Director, introduced Paul Tauke, Urban Forestry Supervisor.

Paul Tauke, Urban Forestry Supervisor, presented an update on the impact of the emerald ash borer in the community.

Deputy City Manager Jamie Letzring reported she attended a meeting at Broadlawns Hospital regarding the possibility of establishing a sobering center that could serve the Des Moines metro area.

Council member Hudson reported he attended a meeting of the Finance and Administration Subcommittee, where discussion was held on tax increment financing (TIF) districts. He also reported a resident had reached out to him inquiring about the conduit network contractor drilling a hole in their driveway, so he wanted to assure residents that this will need to be done for many properties, but the contractors will fill in the holes.

Council member McKinney reported he looked at the area in Valley Junction that has been recommended for a transition zoning, and he suggested the zoning for that area should be done in a comprehensive way. He also reported he attended a meeting of the Development and Planning Subcommittee, where discussion was held on a proposed ordinance regarding accessory structures for outdoor recreation facilities.

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Council member Hardman congratulated Sally Ortgies, Parks and Recreation Director, for being featured in the cover article of a recent issue of the Business Record. She reported she attended the last meeting of the Valley Junction Steering Committee, and she expressed appreciation to Meredith Wells and Nate Hon for their service as co-chairs for that committee. She commended Audrey Kennis, DEI Director, for her efforts in coordinating a DEI consortium. She also commended the Fire Department for the recent publicity for their new ladder truck. She reported the West Des Moines Chamber of Commerce was recently nominated as a finalist for chamber of the year on a national level, and she congratulated the organization for this accomplishment. She also expressed appreciation to Council member for Doug Loots for sitting in on subcommittee meetings in her place while she was out of town.

Mayor Trimble expressed appreciation to the committee members, city staff, and Council members Hardman and Trevillyan, for all the work they contributed for the Valley Junction Steering Committee.
