On Item 1. Call to Order/Approval of Agenda

Schebel moved to approve the agenda as presented. Clark-Wharff seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

On Item 2. Citizen Forum

None.

On Item 3. 3. Approval of Minutes of January 19, 2023 Meeting

Schebel moved to approve the minutes as presented. Clark-Wharff seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

On Item 4 Old Business

None.

New Business

On Item 5A. – Discussion – Cell Towers in Parks

Ortgies stated that there was a recent request from a cell company to install a cell tower in Jordan Creek Park near the rugby fields located at 39th and EP True Parkway. The City intends to formalize the process for cell tower installation which would involve input from the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board when the requested location falls within a park. Ortgies suggested that a cell tower installed near the RecPlex may seem more appropriate and could potentially benefit from the revenue. However, a cell tower located in the middle of a neighborhood park may need further consideration by the Board. Hrdlicka stated that he has also received calls previously about this issue and agrees that cell tower locations should be near similar infrastructure such as powerlines and wires. Schebel added that if the towers are placed in the sightline of people's residences, there may be opposition. A new procedure/policy will be addressed in future meetings.

On Item 5B. - Motion - Approval of Alternate Parkland Dedication Plan

1. The Pines at Glen Oaks

Alvarez stated that the developer plans to build 33 townhome units located at the northeast corner of the Glen Oaks community which equates to .33 acres of parkland dedication. Because this area is served by the fully

established Quail Cove Park, it is recommended that the parkland requirements be fulfilled within their own site. The proposed alternate plan consists of .32 acres of greenway and .18 of parkland. The Facilities Committee agreed that this would be sufficient to cover the dedication requirements.

Till Stange moved to approve the Alternate Parkland Dedication Plan as presented. Schebel seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Staff Reports

On Item 6A. Superintendent of Parks

Alvarez discussed the results of the Polk County Deer Public Hunting program designed to control the deer population in the metro. There were six harvests this year which was slightly down from last year. The three public hunting locations in West Des Moines include Southwoods Park, Raccoon River Park, and the Raccoon River Greenway near 1st Street.

Plans for the 2023 Asphalt Trail Renovation Program will go out to bid in April. These areas will include the section of Jordan Creek Trail west of 60th Street, Westridge Trail starting at EP True Parkway, and Willow Springs Park trail loop. The project is anticipated to start this summer.

There was a discussion to create a master plan study for the section along the Raccoon River Greenway on 1st Street. Input is requested from stakeholders and the public regarding river access, boat launch, and parking lot. Feedback from this study will be presented to the Board.

Alvarez updated the Board on staff recruitment. Two candidates for Park Planner have been certified and an offer has been extended. Currently, five Park Attendant positions have been filled with only two openings remaining.

On Item 6B. Assistant Director of Parks and Recreation

Penning provided staffing updates. Laura Murphy, Superintendent of Recreation, will start on March 27th. The Naturalist position has been filled by Jess Lancial and she will begin at the end of May. Currently, there are 111 lifeguard positions filled which is an improvement from last year. The aquatic centers are scheduled to open on Memorial Day weekend.

Registration for the Spring/Summer programs just opened and showed an increase in revenue from last year.

On Item 6C. Director of Parks and Recreation

Ortgies provided an update on the results of the CIP requests. All were approved except for the last four projects on the list including the shelter and restroom facility at Hidden Point Park, the boat locker phase 3 in Raccoon River Park, and pickleball courts at Scenic Valley Park and Wild Rose Park. The Athene Pedestrian Bridge bid came in \$1.2 million over the engineer's estimated cost which may be due to construction access, steel costs, and earthwork. To make up the cost difference, \$400,000 from the local option sales tax slated for the Marathon Loop Sugar Creek Greenway Phase 2 Trail project, will now be allocated for the pedestrian bridge. Fundraising efforts for the bridge have been successful and are just short of the \$3 million dollar goal. Karen Swalwell pledged \$60,000 in memory of Rick Swalwell. For this donation, there will be signage stating Raccoon River Park Plaza in Memory of Rick Swalwell. There are currently three grant applications including the Prairie Meadows Grant, the Wellmark Foundation Grant, and the Greater Iowa Credit Union Grant for a total potential funding of \$500,000.

Advertisement of Bids – 2023 Asphalt Trail Renovation Project

FINANCIAL IMPACT: None at this time. The preliminary estimated cost of the project is \$412,763.75. Expenses to be paid from G/L account 500.000.000.5250.490. Funding will be covered out of on-going maintenance funds for Trail Renovation (0510 011 2023) and Concrete Renovations in Parks (0510 029 2023).

BACKGROUND: This Resolution is for repair and replacement of portions of existing asphalt trail located along Jordan Creek Trail between EP True Parkway and 60th Street, Westridge Greenway Trail between EP True Pkwy and Fairway Drive, and the loop trail at Willow Springs Park. The locations are shown on the attached map. The areas being addressed were identified based on an annual inspection of the entire trail system by City staff. This project is scheduled to be completed by fall of 2023.

The project will include full depth on-site reclamation of the existing trail to a depth of 12" for use as a base for a new 4" asphalt overlay. The segments of trail are between 18 to 24 years old and showing considerable defects including cracking, spalling and heaving. Other work includes replacement of defective concrete pavement at Willow Springs Park, mobilization, traffic control and other miscellaneous related items. The project includes one (1) add alternate for reconstruction of the asphalt loop trail at Scenic Valley Park.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: The total construction cost of this project is \$940,481.79. Costs of the project have been paid from budgeted CIP funds from G/L Acct 500.000.000.5250.490. Funding was covered out of available funds in the FY 22-23 CIP budget for the Holiday Park Baseball Phase 7 (Project No. 0525 012.0510 014 2022). There was \$950,000 budgeted for this project. There were 5 change orders on the project for a total of \$51,507.79

BACKGROUND: Iowa Athletic Field Construction Co. of Webster City, Iowa is working under an agreement dated April 4, 2022 for construction services related to the Holiday Park Youth Baseball Phase 7 Improvements. Work is substantially complete. This action accepts the improvements and authorizes staff to pay retainage. Retainage will not be paid in less than 30 days.

This project included improvements to the final two baseball fields (Fields 3 & 4) in Holiday Park. Work included demolition of existing dugouts/fields/fencing, grading, stormwater utilities, soil amendments, new infields and warning tracks, refurbishing foul poles, paving of bleacher areas and walkways, new dugouts with player benches, electrical improvements, fencing improvements, new irrigation, sodding of outfields, and other associated items.

ITEM: Motion – Approval of Artists and Artwork Locations – 2023 WDMurals

FINANCIAL IMPACT: Expense of \$18,000 for the artist stipends (\$2,000 per new mural) and \$300 for the Best in Show award for a total of \$18,300. This amount is included in the FY 21-22 public art fund.

SYNOPSIS: The Commission is sponsoring the third, temporary WDMurals exhibit from May 2023 through March 2024. The WDMurals Selection Committee meeting was held on Tuesday, March 7, to review and score 24 proposals that were submitted by 20 artists/artist groups from lowa. For comparison, 37 proposals by 21 artists/artist groups were submitted for the 2022 WDMurals exhibit.

The selection committee members included: Diane Boyd (Commission member), Ryan Crane (Commission member), Missy Berg (Bicycle Advisory Commission member), Joe Moose (WDM Engineering Department), and Tricia Kubicek (Citizen, Artist).

Nine entries were selected to be installed on trail underpass entrance/exit walls. *The mural "Escape" won the 2022 Best in Show Award and will remain in place for the duration of the 2023 WDMurals exhibit. Therefore, five trail underpasses will be the location of 10 (9 new, 1 old) total murals. The committee's recommendations include:
