West Des Moines City Council Proceedings Monday, November 6, 2023

Mayor Russ Trimble opened the regularly scheduled meeting of the City Council of West Des Moines, Iowa, in the Council Chambers of the West Des Moines City Hall on Monday, November 6, 2023 at 5:30 PM. Council members present were: R. Hardman, G. Hudson, D. Loots, M. McKinney, and K. Trevillyan.

On Item 1. Agenda. It was moved by Hardman, second by Trevillyan approve the agenda as presented.

## On Item 2. Public Forum:

Danny Ready, 4001 Ashworth Road, stated he is seeking reimbursement from the City for a fungicide injection that he paid an arborist \$600 to administer to an oak tree on his property, after the City had cut branches from the tree on August 14, 2023, which he believed put the tree at risk of contracting oak wilt. He expressed concerns that the City cut the branches without providing notice and that the cuts were improperly done, presumably due to a lack of training.

Joe Cory, Deputy Public Services Director, reported staff had received a complaint about the branch encroaching three feet above the ground over the public sidewalk and posing a safety hazard to pedestrians. He stated in cases like this, when it is a small limb, staff will cut the limb during the initial visit to eliminate the safety hazard immediately. He also stated the cut was small enough and occurred late enough in the year that staff did not believe it could be harmful to the tree.

Paul Tauke, Urban Forestry Supervisor, reported that his research indicated the risk of oak wilt transmission after July 15<sup>th</sup> is low, and had Mr. Ready consulted with him prior to having the fungicide injection done, he would have advised against paying for that service and suggested a cheaper alternative such as tree paint.

The Mayor and Council held discussion on how to address Mr. Ready's request.

Mayor Trimble requested that the matter be submitted to the Community Compliance Subcommittee for further discussion.

Ivan Webber, 1275 16<sup>th</sup> Street, spoke in support of the City trimming branches of trees on private property when they pose a safety hazard. He noted the City had trimmed a magnolia tree on his property, but the City had every right to do so because it was a safety hazard.

Steve Frevert, Executive Director of the Historic Valley Junction Foundation, reported last year Reader's Digest magazine named Valley Junction the best Christmas community in Iowa; however, they have not yet had a community Christmas tree in the Valley Junction Business District. This year, they have made arrangements with the City to erect an artificial Christmas tree in the driveway in front of the Fire/EMS Administration Building, and there will be a tree lighting ceremony held during the first evening of "Jingle in the Junction" on Thursday, November 16th.

## On Item 3. Council/Manager/Other Entities Reports:

Christina Murphy, General Manager of West Des Moines Water Works, presented information on the proposed creation of the Central Iowa Water Works, a new governmental entity to oversee a regional water utility that would serve the Des Moines metro area communities that decide to join. She noted Central Iowa Water Works would be in charge of the source, treatment, and transmission expansions, while West Des Moines Water Works would still exist to serve the retail aspect for its customers. She noted there will be additional public input meetings, and then the West Des Moines Water Works Board is expected to vote on signing on to the Central Iowa Water Works and the transfer of its assets in December.

Council member Hardman reported she attended a ribbon cutting ceremony for the Taste of the Junction Gallery. She stated she represented the City as a speaker at Stillwell Junior High School's career day. She also reported she will serve as an inaugural member of the West Des Moines Chamber of Commerce Foundation Board.

Council member Hudson reported that tomorrow is the City/School Election Day, and he encouraged everybody to exercise their right to vote.

City Manager Tom Hadden commended Christina Murphy and the Water Works Board of Trustees for their efforts over the past several years working through this process of collaborating with our neighbors on the proposed Central Iowa Water Works concept.
