West Des Moines City Council Proceedings Monday, November 20, 2023

Mayor Pro tem Matthew McKinney opened the regularly scheduled meeting of the City Council of West Des Moines, Iowa, in the Council Chambers of the West Des Moines City Hall on Monday, November 20, 2023 at 5:30 PM. Council members present were: R. Hardman, G. Hudson, D. Loots, M. McKinney, and K. Trevillyan.

On Item 1. Agenda. It was moved by Trevillyan, second by Loots approve the agenda as presented.

On Item 2. Public Forum:

Vicki Long-Hill, 136 10<sup>th</sup> Street, congratulated the City for recently being awarded the 2023 Inclusion Award at the Greater Des Moines Partnership's 11th Annual Inclusion Summit, and she commended DEI Director Audrey Kennis for her efforts and leadership.

David Abbot, 305 41<sup>st</sup> Street, requested a ban on speed cameras in the city, as he believes they can be a detriment to morale in the community.

Council member Hardman reported it was a proud moment for the City to be recognized with the 2023 Inclusion Award by the Greater Des Moines Partnership, and she expressed appreciation to City Manager Tom Hadden and DEI Director Audrey Kennis for their efforts and leadership. He asked for the date the notice was published and the City Clerk indicated the notice

was published on November 3, 2023 in the Des Moines Register. Mayor Pro tem McKinney asked if any written comments had been received. The City Clerk stated on a vote of 4-2, with one member absent, the Plan and Zoning Commission recommended City Council approval of the rezoning request, and one written correspondence was received, which was included with the council communication.

Mayor Pro tem McKinney asked if there were any public comments.

Paul Englis, Microsoft, reported that Project Ruthenium is a data center project and Microsoft is the proposed developer for that project. He stated Microsoft anticipates closing on the property within the next couple weeks and then commencing the site plan process soon after that, which will include opportunities for public input. He acknowledged Microsoft is aware of city requirements on this parcel for screening and lighting considerations, and they are working to incorporate that into their plans for the project.

Carol Reichhardt, 1776 NW 130<sup>th</sup>, Clive, stated she is one of the co-owners of Sargent Farms, which owns the property to the south of this proposed development. She stated the Sargent Farms property is currently used for farming, recreation, meetings, and education, but the owners' long-term plan is to develop the property as residential. She expressed opposition to the proposed data center development project, as she believes it could be a detriment to the current and future uses for the Sargent Farms property and could negatively impact the value of the property. She also stated she believes the character of the entire area should not be changed for the benefit of one user. She requested the City pause the rezoning until the proposed site plan has been fully disclosed to the public, and she requested that the surrounding property owners be included in any discussions throughout the site plan process.

Mayor Pro tem McKinney asked if there were any additional public comments; hearing none he declared the public hearing closed.

It was moved by Loots, second by Trevillyan to consider the first reading of the ordinance.

Council member Loots requested that staff include the surrounding property owners in all discussions throughout the site plan process.

Council member Hardman inquired how Ms. Reichardt has determined the devaluation of the Sargent Farms property as a result of this proposed data center development.

Ms. Reichardt stated she believes the property will be devalued aesthetically and in how it can be used. She stated they have not conducted a thorough evaluation on the financial impact, since the data center use was just revealed to the public earlier today, but she predicts the proposed use would have a negative financial impact on the property.

Lynne Twedt, Development Services Director, noted this action tonight is a consistency zoning for property that is currently unzoned, and it would apply the zoning to the property that is consistent with the comprehensive plan land use.

Mr. Englis stated Microsoft would be happy to talk with the surrounding property owners about the design of the development throughout the site plan process.
