# Independence Day in WDM!



The City's Annual Independence Day Parade will be held on Wednesday, July 3, at 6:30 p.m.

The parade route will begin at Valley West Drive and Ashworth (lineup begins at 5:15 p.m.) and end

at Elm Street (Wilson Park).

The City also will have a Fireworks Display at approximately 9:30 p.m. on Thursday, July 4, at the WDM City Campus by City Hall, 4200 Mills Civic Parkway. Fireworks will NOT be held at Raccoon River Park.

Parking lots (yellow areas on the map) will be open to spectators at 7:00 p.m. Alcohol and grills are not permitted on campus. Parking at Valley Church is allowed only for those with permission. No parking is allowed at Furry Friends Refuge, 3503 Mills Civic Parkway.

City Hall and most City offices will be closed on Thursday, July 4, for the holiday. Garbage collection will be delayed one day for the rest of the week, with Friday's collection occurring on Saturday.



Please note: It is illegal to discharge fireworks in the City limits of West Des Moines.

Only hand-held sparklers, snakes & party pops are allowed.

For everyone's safety, including your own, be a good neighbor and leave the fireworks to the professionals. Just sit back and enjoy our display on July 4!







### A portion of Grand Avenue to close on July 13 & 14

The City of West Des Moines will be hosting the USA Triathlon Youth and Junior National Championships at Raccoon River Park on Saturday, July 13, and Sunday, July 14. Both days of this event will involve closures of Grand Avenue.

#### On Friday, July 12

- ◆ Raccoon River Park will remain open, but swim, bike, and run previews will be taking place throughout the park.
- ◆ The beach will remain open, but the eastern portion of the beach will be reserved for swim preview and course setup; public will have access to the western portion of the beach.
- Grand Avenue will remain open, but a bike preview of the course will be held on Grand Avenue on this day with West Des Moines Police Department assistance.


#### On Saturday, July 13, and Sunday, July 14

- Grand Avenue will be closed from approximately 5:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. from River Ridge
   Drive to South 35th Street. (See map).
- Raccoon River Park main entrance will be closed from approximately 6:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. (access into the park will be via South 11th Street on the east side of the park).

- Parking will be very limited for the duration of the triathlon.
- Beach will be closed to the public for the duration of the triathlon.
- Boat ramp and the Boathouse will be closed to the public for the duration of the triathlon; the Boathouse will operate from 2:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. both days.

THANK YOU to our dedicated Public Services crews who worked so tirelessly to pick up all the debris left from the storms that blew through the area in late May!

This type of operation takes a lot of coordination since it involves several pieces of equipment per crew, along with contracted hauling services. Each crew consisted of a rotation of 2-3 dump trucks, a loader or grappler attachment to pick up the large piles of branches, and several operators collecting the remaining small pieces of debris.

### Mosquito control and tips for homeowners



Did you know that spraying for mosquitos can often be unproductive?

In a community like West Des Moines where significant open spaces and waterways exist,

spraying is not an effective method of control. In lieu of spraying, the City applies larvicide pellets with both helicopters and ground crews. Staff will also treat slow-draining catch basins with abatement materials designed for a slow release of larvicide killer.

The City sprays park areas where large groups gather during holiday weekends, weather permitting; the rest of the year the focus is on minimizing the larvae population. Mosquito spraying does create health concerns for some residents, however, the City always sends media releases prior to spraying.

The CDC recommends that if you're outside, you should use repellent with DEET and wear long-sleeved clothing to prevent mosquito bites.

Additional tips to control mosquitos include:

#### 1. No standing water

- Remove buckets, empty flower pots or other items that may collect water.
- Turn over or cover kids toys with a tarp.
- Tighten outdoor faucets so there is no leaking water.
- Keep gutters & downspouts clear.

#### 2. Plant mosquito-repelling plants

- Mosquitos are naturally repelled by many flowers, herbs and plants such as Marigolds, Catnip, Horsemint and Ageratum.
- **3.** Keep grass short because this helps limit resting places for mosquitos to breed.
- 4. Use yellow "bug" bulbs in outdoor light fixtures.

Please note: If mosquito populations are elevated, the West Des Moines Public Services Department will be spraying for mosquitos in various City parks, weather permitting, starting the evening hours of Sunday, June 30, through Wednesday, July 3. ### Use our service desk to report issues



SeeClickFix is our City Service Desk you can use to report non-emergency issues, such as potholes, graffiti, traffic signal issues, code violations, etc.

#### What should I do if a solicitor knocks on my door?

Spring and summer are the most popular seasons for solicitors to conduct business door-to-door.

City Code, Title 3, Chapter 7, Section 3, states: "No solicitor shall engage in business in the city without having first obtained a license."

Solicitors are required to wear their license on a lanyard around their neck. If you can't see it, it is recommended that you ask to see their permit (which is laminated, and about 3-inches wide and 4-inches tall). Each permit includes the City logo, a photo

of the solicitor, some information about them, and a signature from the City Clerk.

What should I do if a solicitor comes to my door without a City-issued permit? Any issues regarding solicitors should be reported as soon as possible to the non-emergency number for Westcom dispatch at (515) 222-3321. If you are able to call right away and provide a description of the person and the direction you saw them heading after they left your home, this will assist the Police Department in find-

ing them so they can inform them of the City's solicitor laws. The same advice also applies to cases where a licensed solicitor is using overly aggressive sales tactics or refusing to leave your property after being asked to do so.

Does everyone going door-to-door need a solicitor permit from the City? No. Some groups of people don't meet

the definition of a solicitor, so they don't need a solicitor permit. These groups include political campaigns, religious organizations, or fundraisers for schools or other community groups. Questions? Call the City Clerk's office at (515) 222-3600.







Spending your summer working on some home improvement projects?

If you're looking for paint, stain, household cleaners, or more, keep Metro Waste Authority's Swap Shop in mind.

Don't let the name fool you – you don't have to swap to shop! At the Swap Shop, you can find partially used products free of charge. Because the space is stocked with usable material dropped off by metro residents, inventory changes daily. However, items typically include:

- Brake fluid
- Drain cleaner
- Garden products
- Pool chemicals
- Paints and stains
- Sanitizers
- Paint strippers and thinners

The Swap Shop is open from 8 AM – 5 PM, Tuesday through Friday, as well as from 8 AM – Noon on the first and third Saturday each month at Metro Hazardous Waste Drop-Off in Bondurant.

### English Language Learner (ELL) classes resume this fall

English Language Learner (ELL) classes will resume this fall at West Des Moines Human Services. These free classes are designed to teach adults of limited English proficiency how to read, write, and speak the English language.

The classes focus on the fundamental elements of the English language (e.g., spelling, vocabulary, verb tense, grammar). Students are divided into beginning, intermediate and advanced levels. The level of instruction is determined by assessment scores. The classes take place on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10 a.m. to noon in ten-week sessions. The next session begins on September 10th.
