Encountering a bobcat: Tips to stay safe & protect your pets

In recent months, West Des Moines Neighborhood Services Specialists have received reports of bobcat sightings around the city, sparking concerns among residents about encounters with these animals.

With their increasing presence in urban and suburban environments, it's important for peo-

ple to be informed about what to do when they come across a bobcat and how to safeguard their pets from potential harm.

Bobcats are typically shy and avoid human contact. However, they may wander into residential areas in search of food, water, or shelter. If you happen to encounter a bobcat, here are some essential tips to ensure

your safety and the safety of your pets:

- 1. Stay Calm and Back Away Slowly: If you spot a bobcat, the best course of action is to remain calm and avoid sudden movements. Back away slowly while maintaining eye contact with the animal. Do not run, as this may trigger the bobcat's instinct to chase.
- 2. Do Not Approach or Feed the Bobcat: It's crucial to keep a safe distance and never attempt to approach or feed it. Feeding wild animals can make them comfortable with humans, leading to potential conflicts in the future.
- 3. **Protect Your Pets**: When in bobcat territory, keep your pets indoors or supervised when outside. It's also a good idea to keep your pets

up-to-date on their vaccinations and consider installing motion-activated lights or fencing to deter wild animals from your property.

4. **Make Noise**: If a bobcat lingers near your home or exhibits bold behavior, you can try to scare it away by making loud noises, such as shouting. This can help reinforce the bobcat's

natural fear of humans.

5. Contact Local Authorities: If you encounter a bobcat that appears sick or injured, contact Neighborhood Services at (515) 222-3364 or the lowa DNR for assistance. Professionals can assess the situation and take appropriate action.

As our communities continue to expand into natural habitats,

human-wildlife interactions are becoming more common. By understanding how to respond to encounters with bobcats and taking proactive measures to protect our pets, we can coexist with these creatures in a safe and responsible manner.

Remember, the key to ensuring the safety of both humans and wildlife lies in mutual respect and responsible behavior.

Stay informed, stay vigilant, and together, we can create harmonious relationships with the natural world around us.

Illicit discharge reminders: Draining pools and spas



This time of year is often when homeowners start winterizing their outdoor pools and

spas. To protect the quality of water entering nearby ponds, rivers, and streams, it's important to **NOT** discharge pool or spa water into our storm sewer system.

Chlorine and other chemicals in pool and spa water can be hazardous to humans and deadly for freshwater aquatic life. Follow these tips when it's time to empty your pool or spa:

- Don't drain pool and spa water into street, gutter, intakes, storm drains or waterways.
- Pool and spa water can be discharged to the sanitary sewer system if done per City requirements and guidelines.
- If unable to drain to the sanitary sewer, before draining a pool or spa, let the water sit for at least seven days without adding salt, chlorine, or other chemicals.

- If water is drained on the ground, chlorine levels need to be below 0.1 mg/L and the pH is to be between 6.5 and 8.5 before draining.
- If water is drained on the ground, drain across at least 15 feet of grass (not concrete) to allow any remaining chemicals to dissipate before reaching the storm drain.
- Keep the water flow low, about 12 gallons per minute, to prevent erosion of soil and landscaping.
- If proper steps are not taken, draining pool and spa water to a storm sewer system or waterway is considered an illicit discharge and subject to penalties in certain situations per lowa DNR and U.S. EPA regulations.




Plan 2 Ways Out!™

How fast does fire move? Very fast. You could have less than 2 minutes to get out safely once the smoke alarm sounds.


7 steps to practicing your escape plan
