### THE MAYOR'S COLUMN



### Five things every resident should know:

1. Every piece of land is planned to be something someday. That cornfield isn't going to always be a cornfield. If you're going to buy a house, reach out

to Development Services (for land use/zoning issues) and Engineering Services (for streets, storm water, drainage and sanitary sewer issues).

You also may go to the city's website to see what is in store for a particular piece of land before you make a decision to buy. Visit www.wdm.iowa.gov/residents/maps-gir/interactive-gis to see the Comprehensive Plan Land Use Map, FEMA Flood Hazards Map, and zoning and development activities. Remember, the Comp Plan is a living, breathing document that may change over time, but it would be smart to familiarize yourself with it.

- **2.** A street that dead ends into a cornfield is planned to go through that field someday. It won't be your kids' basketball court forever even if it's been that for the last 15 years.
- **3.** My real estate agent told me no one can build behind me, it's a flood plain. If someone brings in fill dirt and builds the land up to one foot above the hundred-year flood plain, they are allowed to build on that site. See the Comprehensive Plan.
- **4.** Wood burning fire pits are legal in West Des Moines as long as they are used to cook hotdogs or marshmallows! Wrong! This is one of the biggest myths. You CANNOT use fire pits that produce smoke for recreational fires even if you are using the fire pit to make food. This is due to air quality regulations within Polk County the city must follow. For enforcement purposes, because our city spans four counties, this has been expanded to include all of our city, regardless of the

county in which you reside. Gas fire pits are okay to use as a listed cooking device provided you immediately extinguish the device when the food is done cooking.

**5.** I'm angry at my property tax bill. I'm going to give the city a piece of my mind. The city is but one piece of your property tax bill. The county assessor assesses your property value based on comparable sales. The hotter the market, the higher your assessed value. The city has nothing to do with that. That said, home values can't grow more than 3% statewide. When they do, a rollback is applied statewide, reducing the percentage of the property that is taxable. Last year, 54% of your property value was taxable. This year, only 46% is taxable.

Just because your assessed value went up doesn't mean the same thing for your property tax bill. The city taxes your property as does the county, the school district, DMACC, Broadlawns and others. All these entities have the ability to adjust their levy rate up or down as necessary to balance their budget.

While the city tax is less than a third of your bill, we have been reducing our city levy rate as often as we can. When I took office, the city levy rate was \$12.05 per thousand. Now it is \$10.85 per thousand.

We've got more work to do, but I'm proud of the work we've done thus far. If every other taxing entity joined the city in our efforts, this could make a decent dent in your property tax bill.

# FROM THE CITY MANAGER



City government requires residents, vendors and contractors to obtain permits and licenses for certain items. Why do we do this? Our efforts are all about safety. Everyone benefits when things are done correctly

and according to City Code.

Although it may seem like an inconvenience, obtaining a permit or license will help you avoid big headaches in the future.

Just last August, an apartment complex in West Des Moines experienced a fire in one of the units, but fortunately, a sprinkler system extinguished the flames. Our building codes require all new construction to be outfitted with sprinklers to keep you safe, and in this case, the sprinklers worked exactly as designed and kept the fire from spreading throughout the entire building.

We also require solicitors to have a permit so we know who is out canvassing in our neighborhoods. When someone knocks on your door with an offer you can't refuse, it's always good to ask to see their laminated card that shows they have a permit from the City to solicit. Then you'll know you're dealing with someone who has passed a round of vetting by the City. We ask solicitors for their criminal history so we can take into account any felony or misdemeanor convictions before issuing them a permit to go door-to-door in West Des Moines.

The City also requires mechanical, electrical, plumbing and building permits as well as block party, special event and sound permits.

If you get a new furnace or air conditioner, we require installers to schedule an appointment with an inspector. This helps us make sure your new equipment was safely installed and followed City Code. If you install it yourself, we also want you to schedule an inspection to make sure your work is up to Code.

In addition, contractors need to apply for permits to do their work for you if you get a new fence, swimming pool, shed or garage, build a new deck or have some remodeling done on your home. If you end up doing the work yourself, you also need to make sure you're aware of our permitting process.

How do you find out what permits are necessary and how to get them?

You can always call our main phone number at City Hall (515-222-3600) and ask to be transferred to the appropriate department for your request, or you can visit our website at www.wdm.iowa.gov and click on "Get a Permit" right under the sliding photos on the main page.

Thanks for working with us to make safety a priority in West Des Moines!



### **HUMAN SERVICES & INCLUSION NEWS**



The recent merger of the Human Services and Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion departments demonstrates the City's commitment to taking comprehensive measures to better serve our residents. In June, our team met to identify current needs and innovative solutions to help streamline services. It's clear that the demands on our community are growing, and this merger will help us address the complexity and diversity of those needs more effectively.

In FY24, West Des Moines Human Services saw a staggering 32% increase in the number

of individuals served through our Food Pantry, marking our highest year on record. In our 45-year history, the demand for assistance has never been higher, and we're breaking records month over month. We've also seen a huge increase in the usage of the Free Medical Clinic, emergency

financial assistance, clothing closet, holiday assistance, and youth programming. This surge is pushing us to reevaluate our services, programs, and capacity. We are ordering more food, needing more volunteers, and having to reconfigure our space to accommodate the growing demand. Although we have limited resources and space, we are committed to finding scalable solutions to ensure that we can continue to support our most under-resourced residents.

To achieve this, we need your support. Here in West Des Moines, we are proud to be a community of choice and a Community of Care. We are the only city in the state that has a Human Services Department - that speaks volumes to our identity and shared values. For nearly five decades, Human Services has

supported low-income families, older adults, individuals with disabilities, and immigrant and refugee populations. However, we could not do this without the help of dozens of volunteers and many donors who support our programs each year. I have witnessed the power and generosity of the human spirit, and I'm confident that we have the power and capacity to come together and solve the challenges ahead.

West Des Moines is well-positioned to serve as a national leader and model to other cities.

A Community of Care is not just about what you do for your community but also what your community does for you. Every day of the week, city staff show up to ensure you have access to critical services. Now, we're asking you to show up and help us build a healthy, inclusive, and compassionate

community. Demonstrating care doesn't have to be expensive or time consuming. West Des Moines has an estimated population of over 70,000 (which doubles during the daytime), more than 870 street lane miles, and high expectations from the motoring public. The City's snow and ice control policies and procedures are vital in keeping roadways safe in the winter. The City's responsibility is to conduct winter maintenance activities expediently, efficiently, and safely.

#### **Priority for Snow Removal**

- 1. Major arterial streets
- 2. Collector streets
- 3. Residential streets
- 4. Unimproved streets, alleys, public sidewalks, trails, and public parking lots



### **Snow Emergency Parking Ban**

If there's snow, there is likely a **Snow Emergency Parking Ban** to accomplish the efficient removal of snow.

If a prediction for snow or winter weather conditions exists, check the City's website at www.wdm.iowa.gov for a news alert. You may also sign up for email or text message alerts, check the City's Facebook page, or call the **Snow Hotline at 515-273-0766** to see if there is a Snow Emergency Parking Ban in place. All are available 24/7.



Vehicles must be removed from all Cityowned parking areas when a Snow Emergency Parking Ban is in effect. Vehicles parked in these areas are subject to being

towed and/or a \$50 ticket. The parking ban is effective from its proclamation through 5:00 p.m. the following day, unless it is extended by an additional proclamation due to the length of the storm or volume of snowfall.

**Now** is the perfect time to **make a plan** for when a Snow Emergency Parking Ban is in place and parking is not allowed on the street.

"I saw a snowplow go down my street and thought I could park there now!"

Depending on storm and road conditions, plows may make additional passes down your street. Please follow the expiration date and time from the Snow Emergency Parking Ban to avoid a ticket or tow.

### If your vehicle is towed during a Snow Emergency Parking Ban, follow these steps:

- Go to the Police Dept., 250 Mills Civic Pkwy (Open 24/7)
- Provide ID showing the vehicle is yours or you were the driver
- Ask for an impound release (no charge)
- Go to Roy's Towing, 155 S. 13th St., WDM
- Pay Roy's Towing fees (towing/storage) and pick up your vehicle
- If a City ticket has been issued, you can either pay at City Hall (4200 Mills Civic Pkwy) or pay online through Xpress Bill Pay
- Be proactive in the future by keeping vehicles off the street during winter weather

### **Pay Parking Ticket Online Using**

If you received a parking ticket XPress BILL PAY

because your car was parked on the street during a snow parking ban, you now have the option to pay that ticket online. Search for 'Collections' on the City website at wdm. iowa.gov, and from there select the Online Payment Portal link to continue to **Xpress Bill Pay**. Then simply follow the prompts to pay your parking ticket online.


### **Citizen Responsibilities**

Snow can be beautiful, but it can also create hazards. When residents fail to clear sidewalks, falls and injuries may occur. Please place the snow on private property or adjacent to the right of way, not in the street. City ordinances prohibit snow from being placed in the street.



Residents are required by City Ordinance 7-1-5 to clear sidewalks (including those crossing alleys, crosswalks, and driveways) within 24 hours of the end of a storm.

A helpful hint for residents – clear your sidewalk *after* the snowplows have completely finished plowing the street to the curb. If your sidewalk is icy, please apply sand or applicable deicer product to alleviate the hazard, reduce pedestrian injury, and minimize your exposure to liability.



#### **Mailboxes**

The City will plow the snow within the confines of curb line to curb line of a street. During extreme winter weather events there may be times when City plows cannot physically place the snow onto the public right-of-way (commonly referred to as the "parking"). During these times, the resident will be responsible for clearing the snow around their mailbox to ensure delivery of mail.

It is also the resident's responsibility to ensure that their mailbox is properly installed with the face of the door six to eight inches behind the face of the curb. The post should be at least 24" away from the face of the curb, and it should be adequately constructed to withstand snow clearing efforts but meet "breakaway" criteria. In the fall of the year, staff conduct preseason inspections of mailbox placement throughout the community. If a mailbox is found to be out of compliance, staff will notify the resident with a door hanger so the proper corrections can be made before winter begins. Damage to mailboxes that have not been repaired or brought into compliance will not be eligible for a claim adjustment.


#### Q. How do we know when the Snow Emergency Parking Ban is in effect?

There are many options to learn of a Snow Emergency Parking Ban:

- **1.** Visit www.wdm.iowa.gov. Look for the News article and banner at the very top of the page.
- 2. Email & text message alerts:
  - Sign up for e-mails at www.wdm. iowa.gov/eNotification.
  - To sign up for snow parking ban text messages, click the red link on the eNotification page to visit a sign-up page. Click SNOW EMERGENCY under the News Category.
- 3. Follow the City of West Des Moines – City Manager's Office on Facebook

#### Q. Can't the City remove the snow they put in my driveway or sidewalks?

Unfortunately, we cannot. When you consider the vast number of driveways and sidewalks throughout the City, it would be very expensive for taxpayers to provide this type of service. While we try our best to minimize the amount of snow that is placed on these areas, it cannot always be avoided.



## Q. Who do I call to get the public to shovel their sidewalks?

City ordinance requires property owners to shovel their sidewalks within 24 hours after the end of a storm. You may report un-shoveled walks to Community Compliance at 515-222-3480 or by using the City's online service desk, SeeClickFix. Just look for the SeeClickFix logo at the bottom of our website.

# Q. May I shovel/plow/blow the snow from my sidewalk or driveway into the street?

No. City ordinance prohibits this activity due to the hazardous conditions it can create in the street. Violators may be fined. *See City Code Sections 7-1-4 and 7-1-5*.

# How Can You Help During a Winter Event?

- Be sure your vehicle is off the street if it snows.
- While you're shoveling your sidewalk, dig out the fire hydrant too!
- Volunteer (if you're able) to help others remove snow.
- Give the snowplows plenty of room on the roadway.
- If you must venture out, check weather, road conditions, and traffic.

### Track-A-Plow - See What Roads Are Plowed

Many residents want to know: "When will my street be plowed?"

Information regarding this question is just a few clicks away on the City's website. "Track-A-Plow" uses Automatic Vehicle Location (AVL) technology and the data feeds into a

street system map that allows residents to see what roads on the City street system have been plowed.

The City of West Des Moines has established priorities for each classification of streets. Major arterial streets that must be kept open for emergency vehicles are the highest priority. Depending on storm



conditions, crews may have an opportunity to start plowing some residential streets before the storm ends. Ongoing weather and the number of vehicles obstructing plows on roads has a major impact on the effectiveness of

our operations. It takes several hours to complete the plowing of all City streets. If a storm ends in the morning, it will probably be later in the day before crews will be able to complete plowing residential streets and other priorities. Once again, the major roads in the City have priority and need to be plowed first.

### **WDM City Code**

The following is the City's regulation on snow emergency parking bans which is being published in accordance with the City Code regulation:

#### **6-6-7: SNOW REMOVAL:**

No person shall park, abandon, or leave unattended any vehicle on any public street, alley, or city owned off street parking area during any snow emergency proclaimed by the mayor, public works director, or their respective designees. A snow emergency parking ban shall continue from its proclamation through five o'clock (5:00) P.M. the following day. The mayor, public works director, or their respective designees may extend the duration of the parking ban if conditions require additional time to clear the snow and ice. Notice of an extension shall be posted in the same manner as a proclamation of snow emergency and shall contain the date and time the parking ban shall expire. Such a parking ban shall be of uniform application. The city shall publish information regarding the responsibilities of vehicle owners under this section in the fall and/or winter editions of the "WDM Magazine" distributed to city residents, as well as post such information on the city of West Des Moines website in the fall and/ or winter of each year. When predictions or occurrences indicate the need, the mayor, public works director, or their respective designees, shall proclaim the snow emergency and direct the appropriate city employee to post said proclamation on the city of West Des Moines website and forward notice of the proclamation to at least two (2) radio and two (2) television stations that broadcast their signals into the city of West Des Moines. Such emergency may be extended or shortened as the emergency warrants or when conditions warrant. This section shall not be construed as suspending parking limitations or restrictions imposed by any other section of this title. In addition to enforcement of this section by police officers, code enforcement officials and public works employees have the authority to enforce the provisions of this section. The code enforcement officials and public works employees shall have the power to issue citationcomplaints for violations of this section and impound vehicles found in violation of this section as provided in subsections 6-6-15A and G of this chapter. (Ord. 1844, 10-5-2009)

The City of West Des Moines invites you to participate in our initiative to enhance tree diversity and enrich the urban tree canopy. Thanks to a grant from Microsoft Corporation, residents can acquire native trees, usually valued between \$60 and \$120, for only \$30 each.

All buyers must reside in West Des Moines and commit to planting their selected tree(s) on private property within city limits. Each residence is limited to purchasing a maximum of two trees. Deliveries will occur the week of April 28.

To ensure you receive your preferred tree varieties, be sure to make your purchases between **February 1** and **April 20**, as some options may sell out quickly. The sooner you buy, the better your chances of securing the trees you desire!

### KEEP 'EM LOOSE

When it comes to recycling, keep 'em loose! To recycle right, keep all plastic bags out of your Curb It! carts and do not place recycling in bags.

#### Why Loose?

When your recycling leaves the curb, it goes to Metro Waste Authority's Metro Recycling Facility. There, the recycling

equipment sorts items by type, and they must go through the process loose for the equipment and staff to recognize each item.

Plastic bags can also be tanglers in the equipment – like bubblegum in somebody's hair! That means that anything that's bagged has to be thrown away.



#### **Accepted Items**

Items that belong in your recycling cart include:

- Newspapers
- Junk mail
- Cardboard
- Plastics with a twist-off lid
- Aluminum and tin cans
- Glass bottles and jars

Remember to give your recyclables a good rinse!

Once it's empty and clean, toss it on in your Curb It! cart.

# HOUSESIDE HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION

Did you know that rechargeable batteries, old lightbulbs, used paints and stains, and other household hazardous waste can be picked up just outside your door? This is possible through Metro Waste Authority's houseside collection program!

Houseside collection works like an Amazon or grocery delivery. If you want to use the service, simply sign up at www. WhereItShouldGo.com/Houseside, and Metro Waste Authority will come to you. The service is provided as needed, and you only pay if you choose to use it.

For a \$25 fee, you'll receive two 12-gallon plastic bins to fill with materials like paint or lawn chemicals, and a large plastic bag for items that are too large for the bins such as computers, printers, or laptops. Once your bins and bag are filled, you can schedule collection with Metro Waste Authority at 515.244.0021. Then, just place your items outside by 8 AM on your pickup day.

#### **Drop-off Options**

If you are doing extensive cleaning and would rather drop off your hazardous waste, materials can be taken to the Metro Hazardous Waste Drop-Off in Bondurant or the Metro Northwest Transfer Station in Grimes (by appointment only).

Common household items like bleach, rechargeable batteries, oil-based paints, lawn chemicals, old motor oil or gasoline, and energy efficient lightbulbs (CFL) are all accepted for free.

# CURBSIDE YARD WASTE COLLECTION IS LEAF-ING FOR THE SEASON

The Compost It! curbside yard waste collection will end for the season the week of **November 25, 2024**, on your regular collection day.

The program accepts small twigs and branches, leaves and lawn clippings, as well as any garden vegetation. Just avoid dirt, mulch, rocks, and food.

To have your yard waste collected until the end of the season, be sure to tag it, bag it, or wheel it:

- **Tag It:** Brush bundles and store-brand bags require a green Compost It! sticker for collection. Brush bundles can be no larger than 4 feet long by 18 inches in diameter.
- **Bag It:** Put loose yard waste such as lawn clippings, leaves, and garden vegetation in Compost It! bags or store-brand bags with a green Compost It! sticker. Compost It! bags and stickers are sold at many local grocery, home improvement, and convenience stores.
- Wheel It: If you've enrolled in the Compost It! cart service, toss everything in your cart and take it to the curb on your normal collection day.

Iowa weather always keeps us guessing, so if you have yard waste left after November, you'll have one more chance to have it collected. Winter collection will occur **December 30, 2024** through **January 10, 2025** on your regular

collection day. During winter collection, regular yard waste as well as live Christmas trees can be disposed of curbside.

### THE INVISIBLE KILLER: CARBON MONOXIDE



Often called the invisible killer, carbon monoxide (CO) is an invisible, odorless, colorless gas. It can be produced by the combustion that occurs from a fuel-burning appliance like a furnace, clothes dryer, range, oven, water heater, or space heater. When appliances and vents work properly, and there is enough fresh air in your home to allow complete combustion, the trace amounts of CO produced are typically not dangerous.

An appliance can malfunction, a furnace heat exchanger can crack, vents can clog, or debris may block a chimney or flue. Fireplaces, wood-burning stoves, gas heaters, charcoal grills, or gas logs can produce unsafe levels of CO if they are unvented or not properly vented. Exhaust can seep into the home from vehicles left running in an attached garage. All these things can cause a CO leak in the home. Following our carbon monoxide safety tips can help prevent potential CO poisoning.

#### Where should carbon monoxide alarms be installed?

CO alarms should be placed in a central location outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home. For the best protection, use interconnected CO alarms so that when one sounds, they all sound. Follow the manufacturer's instructions for placement and mounting height. Choose a CO alarm that is listed by a qualified testing laboratory.

#### How do I know if my carbon monoxide alarm is working?

Test CO alarms at least once a month by pressing the test button. Read the back of the CO alarm, or the manufacturer's instructions, to know what the different sounds mean. Typically, four beeps and a pause mean CO has been detected. You should move to fresh air and call 9-1-1. One chirp every minute means low battery, and it's time to replace the batteries. Five chirps every minute means the CO alarm is at the end of its life, and it's time to replace the CO alarm.

#### Are there any other safety tips I should know?

If you need to warm a vehicle, remove it from the garage immediately after starting it. Do not run a vehicle or other fueled engine or motor indoors, even if garage doors are open. Make sure the exhaust pipe of a running vehicle is not covered with snow.

During a snowstorm, make sure vents for the dryer, furnace, stove, and fireplace are clear of snow build-up.

A generator should be used in a wellventilated location outdoors away from windows, doors, and vent openings.

Gas or charcoal grills can produce CO. Only use them outside.

Have fuel-burning heating equipment and chimneys inspected by a qualified professional every year before cold weather arrives. During the heating season, clear filters and filtering systems of dust and dirt.

#### What are symptoms are carbon monoxide poisoning?

CO enters the body through breathing. CO poisoning can be confused with flu symptoms, food poisoning and other illnesses. Some symptoms include shortness of breath, nausea, dizziness, lightheadedness, or headaches. High levels of CO can be fatal, causing death within minutes. If you suspect possible CO poisoning, get to fresh air, and seek medical care right away.







### **NEW PARK PLAYGROUNDS**



Crossroads Park

The play equipment in the city generally has a lifespan of 18 to 20 years. However, the structures at Crossroads Park, Jaycee Park, and Kiwanis Park had been in place for 22 years, surpassing their expected duration. This project aimed to rejuvenate these parks by replacing the play equipment for children aged 2-5 and 5-12.

The upgrades included demolition of the outdated structures and the installation of new features, such as:

Enhanced Safety: Substituting wood mulch surfacing with poured-in-place safety surfacing, along with the addition of accessible pathways made of concrete pavement and

Inclusive Play: Implementing play features that cater to children of all abilities.

Improved Drainage: Establishing proper grading and installing subdrains.

As a result, this project has revitalized the parks, offering safe, inclusive, and accessible play areas for children of all ages and abilities.

### **LEGACY WOODS**

The transformation of Legacy Woods into a vibrant public space is progressing steadily. The site's revitalization began with the demolition of abandoned buildings in June 2024, followed by an archaeological assessment in September to preserve areas of historical significance. Cleared sections were then seeded with grass, setting the stage for the future.

October saw the planting of 79 trees, forming the core of the planned Nature Sanctuary. The West Des Moines Historical Society, in collaboration with the City, showcased the project during the September Iowa Files program, offering a comprehensive overview available on the City's website at www.wdm.iowa.gov/ LegacyWoods.

Future stages include site grading, underground utility installation, and the construction of a paved parking lot, pending funding. These projects are slated for completion by the end of 2025.




