FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Approximately \$100,000 to be funded from account 500.000.000.5250.490 with the ultimate funding anticipated to come from General Obligation Bonds.

BACKGROUND:

The City Council held workshops on November 7, 2022, and January 3, 2023, to discuss the possible inclusion of a multi-use trail and the road design criteria (3-lane vs 4-lane) on the Ashworth Road Improvements. In those meetings and subsequent discussion, the City Council suggested that a section of Ashworth Road be restriped to 3-lanes to observe performance for a stretch of time.

OUTSTANDING ISSUES:

Staff has reviewed this suggestion and recommends the following:

- Remove existing pavement markings and restripe existing Ashworth Road (36 feet wide from curb face to curb face) from 1st Street to 19th Street as a 3-lane roadway with a 12-foot center turn lane and two 11-foot through lanes with a 1-foot curb offset. This will meet design standards per Iowa Statewide Urban Design Standards and Specifications (SUDAS). Modifications to traffic signals at 1st Street and at 8th Street may also be necessary to accommodate the changes to the intersection approaches. 


